Tel Fred he had better look out where he carries hes to give my best respects to Fred and tell him I should like to see him west much, ash him if he has got most ready to go to sea. how does Mrs Holland and Lydia do nom! should like to see their very much, give my bust respects to them, is Marg mitte you now give my best suspects to her and tell her I am going to write to her soon, how is Martha Ann and all her children, I should like to see them very much.
