My dear Mr. Holzmann:

Enclosed find exhibit of Mr. Sellers to the Railroad Commission, that will be of interest, based on the delivery of gravity from the city's system the last ten years, the yearly average being 2,084,786,789 gallons. Will you kindly, at your convenience, determine the cost of water per thousand gallons delivered at University Heights Reservoir, including the cost of the repairs this year to the Dulzura Conduit, the cost of the pipeline between Upper ^{estimated} and Lower Otay dams and the cost of construction of the new conduit from Wilde's Dam to Upper Otay. This will be appreciated.

I should also like to know what is your determination as to cost of water per thousand gallons for the year 1915, based on actual cost to the city.

This information at your convenience will be appreciated.
