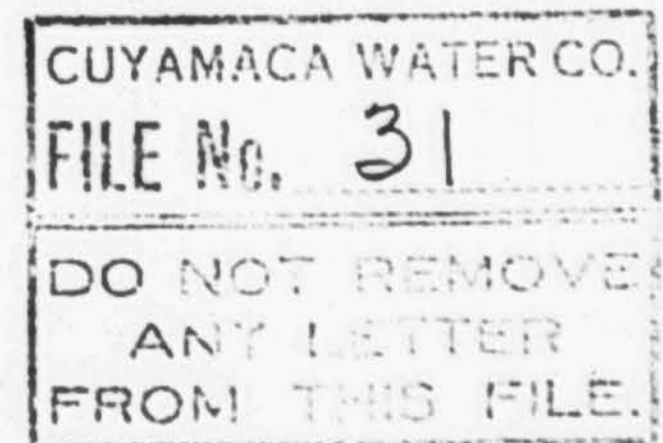

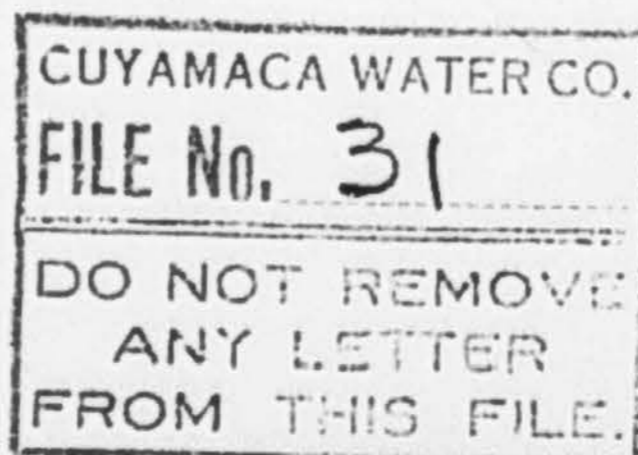
My Dear Mr. Faude:

Answering yours of December 29th; tell Mr. Mullins that there is absolutely no use of his coming to San Diego; all he has to do is to send in his monthly report and I will send it to Mr. Whyte, the State Parole Officer. If Mr. Mullins wants to be sure about it tell him to write the State Parole Officer in San Francisco tell him he is working for me, and ask him if he can't send his monthly report to me each month, and not be compelled to come to town as he loses two or three days by so doing. Mr. Mullins is one of the men that I employed before they appointed me Probation Officer and I did not know that he was making a trip to San Diego each month - it is too bad. I have eight or ten men on parole now and they mail me their monthly reports.

Please have the Cuyamaca Water Company and the Volcan Land & Water Co. each pay Mr. Makin \$35. per month, commencing January 1st, 1916.
