Dear Dr. Koprowski:

I am enclosing a memorandum, dated January 25th, 1957 which I should like to discuss with you. It is based on the assumption - by no means sure to be correct - that delayed type hypersensitivity is mainly, and perhaps solely, responsible for the disease resistance to polio of those who had polio. If this assumption is correct, then it would be unnecessary to use an attenuated live polio virus for purposes of vaccination. One could rather endow patients with delayed type hypersensitivity to polio and ipso facto - so we assume - with the same kind of disease resistance that a vaccination with attenuated live polio virus would confer.

This assumption can be easily tested in the case of polio. Should it prove to be correct, then it would be reasonable to assume further - again, by no means sure that this is correct - that disease resistance could be conferred on patients in a similar manner also against typhoid fever and other enteric infections.

I discussed my memorandum with Jonas Salk who thought that I might be able to interest you in setting up some such experiments in your laboratory. I was thinking primarily of establishing the facts for polio and then working on some enteric infections in rats or mice.

If Pappenheimer's paper is correct, it should be possible to confer delayed type hypersensitivity through intracutaneous injection of a mixture of antigen with a fourfold excess of type specific antibody. I expect to be in New York on March 1st, and I shall try to telephone to you and perhaps set up an appointment for Saturday, March 2nd, or if that is not convenient, for some other date. I shall be in New York for only a short time on this occasion but I expect to spend quite a lot of time in the East all through the rest of the year. This would make it easier for us to collaborate, which certainly would give me great pleasure.

It is conceivable that one might justify this work from the point of view of Lederle on the ground that some commercial interest is involved, and it is even conceivable that if the idea of conferring disease resistance through injecting a mixture of antigen antibody into the skin is new, use of such mixtures might be patentable - which I assume would make Lederle happy.

I am also enclosing another memorandum dated February 5th which might perhaps interest you.
