had forwarded and taken
the painting back, for I

could have sold it many
times for at least hundred
at the least and a thousand
or more.

I regret that I did not
make my telegram more
definite in its purport; I
find it thinking I could
~~sell~~ you with the understanding
~~of~~ ^{that} of selling it were at a
good profit for you.

I was not trying to in
any way take advantage
of you or ~~to~~ your possession
of the painting.

I am loaning an entire
collection of my paintings
(free of charge) to the women
of Calif. This is to assist
them to promote interest
in the redwoods and will
thus raise fifty thousand

dollars toward the purchase
of Dyerville Flat Grove. The
Save the Redwood League
is to furnish the other
fifty thousand² so our southern
chairman announced last
week.

Your painting kind of that
very grove I thought it would
attract a great deal of attention
and assist greatly for the
cause, for we are all
working as diligently.

My idea was that I could
exhibit it in this cause and
undoubtedly sell it to you
since it has been a helping
bazaar - if you so desired.
I am truly sorry you
misjudged my motive.
