My dear Mr. Strobeck:

We appointed Mr. Mueller, Mr. McKinnon and you a committee of three to raise the funds by private subscription in El Cajon, the money to be deposited in your bank to the credit of Mr. Sherwood Wheaton, to be checked out by Mr. Wheaton.

As you are probably aware, neither the County Highway Commission nor the Board of Supervisors can spend a dollar of county money on this road, and the money must be raised by private subscription. We need about \$1,000 more in El Cajon, besides the money already raised.

My suggestion is that the first half of the subscriptions be paid within thirty days, and the last half in four months from date.

Mr. Mueller is chairman of this committee, and I presume he has taken the matter up with you before this. I am working on Mr. Cosgrove and Mr. Riley and hope to get a liberal subscription from them.
