THE TRADITION CONTINUES

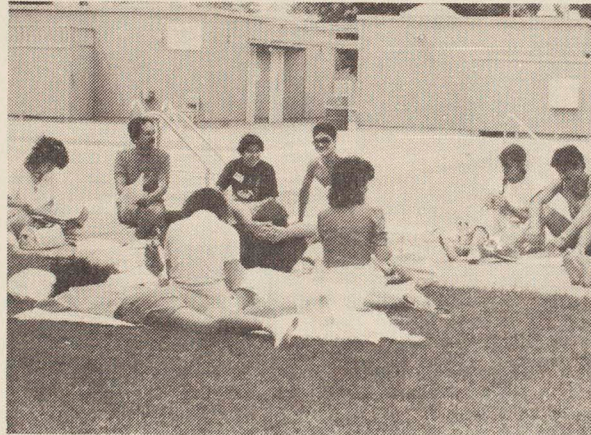

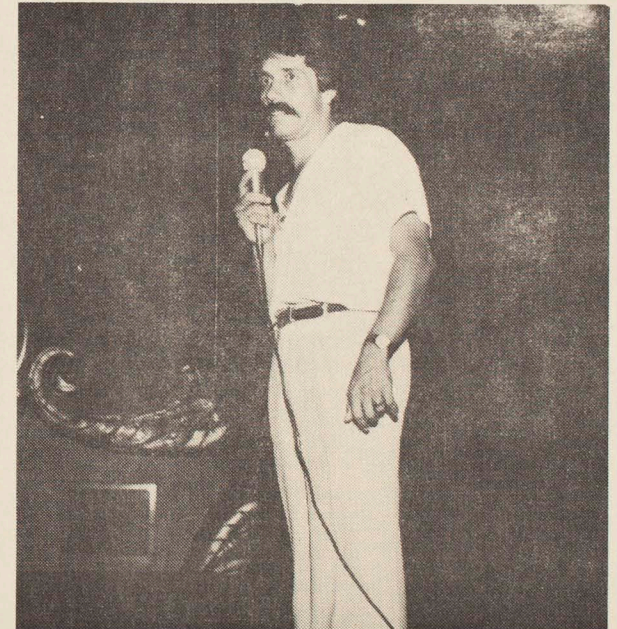
STUDENT PARTICIPATION
