Dear Sir:-

Regarding the Snow Creek matter which we discussed last November and which constitutes a part of the water appropriations filed by Harrison Albright and Susie B. Albright and now pending before the State Department of Public Works - Division of Water Rights and numbered 499, 584, 830, 835, 1043 and 2238. You advised me that the Southern Sierras Power Company has acquired from the Albrights all water rights, rights of construction, rights of power development and use of the waters of Snow Creek but that it has no interest in any other rights covered by the said Albright applications.

Southern Pacific Land Company has recently filed its protest against the allowance of any or all of the Albright applications.

However, I am prepared to recommend to Southern Pacific Company that it deal with Southern Sierras Power Company on the following basis:

- (1) That a stipulation be filed, signed by all parties concerned, and an adjudication thereupon be entered, by the Water Rights Division of the State Department of Public Works confirming in Southern Pacific Company the permanent right to 3.2 second feet of water from Snow Creek for use for railroad and allied purposes.
- (2) Thereupon in consideration of \$25,117.64 to be paid to it by Southern Sierras Power Company, Southern Pacific Company will convey, or cause to be conveyed, to Southern Sierras Power Company the following described property:

also permission to use for the development of power the 3.2 second feet of Snow Creek water hereinbefore referred to, subject to the condition that Southern Pacific Company's right .to such 3.2 second feet of water shall be permanent, and that such quantity of water after being used by the Southern Sierras Power Company for the development of power, shall be delivered into Southern Pacific Company's constructed pipe line leading from its present Snow Creek intake to Whitewater Station, such delivery to be made by gravity at such point in said pipe line as may be designated by Southern Pacific Company.

- from such conveyances the right of way 50 feet in width for Southern Pacific Company's constructed pipe line through the Secs. 20 and 21 aforesaid.
- East, have not as yet been surveyed by the United States and therefore have not been patented under the provisions of the grant of July 27, 1866 to Southern Pacific Railroad Company.

The Swip of Nwip and win of Swip of Sec. 21 and the Neil of Neil of Sec. 29, Twp. 3 South, Rge.3 Bast, have been surveyed by the United States, application for patent pursuant to the grant of 1866 has been filed, but patent has notyet issued.

Conveyance of the foregoing tracts will be by quitclaim deed.

Necessarily, this whole matter will have to be submitted to the Executive Committee of Southern Pacific Company for approval and authorization, but before submitting it, I will be glad to know from you that the suggested settlement will be satisfactory to the Southern Sierras Power Company. Upon being so advised, I will immediately submit the matter for the necessary approval.

After it shall have been approved, then the details, including the payment of the purchase price, filing the necessary stipulation, securing the adjudication and executing the conveyances, can be taken care of in due course.
