Sir,

I refer to your communication of the 15th June, 1937,
No. S. 9029.

It is now proposed that I should co-operate in research work, to be carried out at the Clarendon Laboratory, Oxford, which once started will have to be continued for a number of years. I understand that accordingly, my present arrangement with Imperial Chemical Industries is to be replaced by another arrangement, to start from the 1st of January, 1938, and to cover a period of four years. I also understand that my position with regard to the University of Oxford will be regularised during the next term.

I am writing to you in order to inform you that I am terminating my present arrangement with Imperial Chemical Industries on December 31st, with a view to starting a new arrangement on January 1st, 1938. At the same time I wish to ask you whether you would, in the circumstances, grant me an unconditional permit to stay in this country.

II.

Professor Lindemann, who is in charge of the Clarendon Laboratory, Oxford, will send you a copy of the proposed four years' arrangement with the Imperial Chemical Industries, when a draft of this arrangement will be available, and also give you general information regarding my work at Oxford.

In support of the present application, I shall send you a statement from my Bank, from which you will see that I am not without private means.

Dear Sir,

My present agreement with your firm, as set out in your letter of the 17th of Febr. 1936, would continue until June 1st, 1938.
