My interest is aroused from the fact that I am the Vice President of the above Company, which is taking over the Byrne tract of some 4000 acres adjoining the town of Hemet.

We are also prospectively interested in a still larger tract nearby, and while we have several sources of supply for water thereabouts, we are in a most respective state of mind, if anything better than that which has come to our notice so far, is offered.

Whether correct or not, I have been told you are shortly to bring water to Perris and vicinity. If that is true you could easily leave some of it enroute.

I have probably told you enough to show my interest, and I will appreciate having as much information as you can place before me. Perhaps there is someone I can call upon in Los Angeles who is fully conversant with the subject.
