#### STATE MONUMENTS

#### Nevada County

. . . .

Donner Monument, ll acres. Memorial to a party of emigrants who left Illinois in the spring of 1846 under the leadership of Jacob Donner and James P. Reed, and who were snowbound during the winter, suffering the loss of 42 lives before being rescued by General Sutter.

#### El Doredo County

Marshall Monument, 17 acres. Memorial to James A. Marshall, who first discovered gold in California on the American River, January 24, 1848.

#### Sonoma County

Fort Ross, Old Russian Fort, founded in 1812, called "Stawiansky" by the Russians.

Mission San Francisco de Solano. Early Spanish Mission, founded in 1823.

Vallejo Foms, Memorial to General Vallejo, 20.1 acres, purchased from State Park Bond Funds and contributions of the Vallejo Memorial Society, \$17,300.00

#### Solano County

Soleno Menument, Memorial to Chief Solano, 3.04 acres, land purchased from funds contributed by Massasoit Tribe of Redmen and monument erected by Act of State Legislature.

#### Monterey County

First Theater in California. It was constructed as a sailors' boarding house by John A. Swan, pioneer of 1843, who built it soon after his arrival. Amateur performances held by soldiers of Jonathan D. Stevenson's regiment of New York Volunteers during the winter of 1847.

Junipero Serra Landing Place at Monterey, June 3, 1770/

Custom House. Commodore John Drake Sloat raised the American Flag on July 7, 1846, marking the passing of the Mexican regime and the Introduction of the American rule in California.

#### Los Angeles County

Hacienda de Governor Pio Pico, one third acre. Adobe mansion of Pio Pico, who was first Mexican Jovernor of California, 1832733, and during a short time in 1846.

#### San Diego County

San Pasqual Battlefield Monument. Memorial to the Battle of San Pasqual, which was the only conflict of note in the entire conquest of California, and was fought on December 5, 1846.

Dear Senators

I again missed you on my visit to San Diego, September 6th. Reason for missing you on both occasions has been due to the fact that I must spend my Saturdays, Sundays and holidays on field inspection trips, the remainder of my time being occasumed with office details.

In reply to your latest communication, copies of which were sent to Chairman Joseph R. Knowland and Director William H. Moore. I have discussed with the above referred to gentlemen your plea for the granting of another logging road route through Prairie Creek State Park for the use of the California Barrel Company, and the general opinion is that no additional roads should be granted to this concern which would involve the removal of any sizable redwood trees.

My most recent check with the State Division of Highways, regarding future new road alignment on the Redwood Highway to the Flamath River, develop the fact that the Division of Highways has as yet not decided on the future route and that this project will probably not be constructed until after the duration, or in other words, it is being considered as a post war project.

The possible acquisition of any of the Ward Properties for State Park purposes, could only be brought about by a definite legislative appropriation of funds for that specific purchase.

The next State Park Commission Meeting has been rescheduled to be held in the State Building at San Francisco on September 17th and 18th, and any further communication from you will be given gracious consideration at that time.
