Mr. Murray wired me suggesting I wire you regarding Senate Bill three six four six. City of La Mesa towns of Lemon Grove and Bostonia at fully representative mass meetings have wired committees urging delay action on bill until city council agree to city attorney Cosgroves statement before Public Lands committee that City make no objection our building diverting dams at our intakes. We furnish three cities four towns with water their only source of supply. It is a fight municipality vs municipality. San Diego has several other sources of supply less costly and immediately available. Urge you appear before Senate committee Wednesday morning asking no action be taken for thirty days until city attorney returns here and compromise effected as outlined in his testimony before House Public Lands Committee. Many more meetings of protest against bill planned this coming week. See telegrams sent Senator Myers.
