Governor Pete Wilson God Father of Hate Crime

Offices of Committee on Chicano Rights Attacked!

National City Ca Feb. 17, 1995. The headquarters of the Committee on Chicano Rights in National City have been attacked in the middle of the night by racist elements.

Two attacks were leveled at the offices of the Committee on Chicano Rights (CCR) at night. The first one occurred early Wednesday morning Feb. 8. The second one happened on Sunday Feb. 12, 1995. In both instances damage resulted from the attack by unknown persons.

The first attack was carried out around four in the morning. No one witnessed the act. Two large rocks weighing between five and eight pounds were hurled against the building's front plate windows which are approximately 8 ft by 8 ft each. The left plate window had an eight inch diameter hole made by the rock. The right plate window had a one foot diameter hole made by the other rock. It didn't shatter. Both windows were severely cracked.

"After the first incident I was inclined to write it off as a random act of vandalism by unknown persons." ^{STATED BACA} The incident was reported to the National City Police in the morning shortly after I arrived for work. N.C.P.D. Officer J. Kenneth White made an investigation and took the boulders which were hurled through the windows.

The status of the incident being a "random" vandalism changed dramatically at 4:55 PM Thursday Feb. 9. At that time a young White Anglo person called Baca at his office and asked if this was the office of the Committee on Chicano Rights. In an obvious reference to the statements made during the Prop 187 campaign by Governor Wilson and his minions, the caller said "I understand you 'greasers' want to take over California. You get back! You can't take over your own block, let alone California. Baca responded with a comment "That might be true, but I'll tell you one thing, you can take over your ^{piece} ~~piece~~ of land." The caller responded angrily "You think you can?" Baca replied: "You called, so I assume you know where I am. Come on down and find out." The caller then began ranting and raving about Prop 187 and using vile language and cursing Baca and all persons of Mexican ancestry.

No more than 15 minutes later another racist call was received. According to Baca, the caller seemed older. He also was a White Anglo. "The caller asked if this was the office of the Committee on Chicano Rights." "You bet it is." Baca replied. "I understand you 'greasers' are going to take over California and us." The caller said. Baca, now angered, responded: "Why don't you ask your big mouth buddy next to you." The caller replied: "If you think your people are going to take us over, then we might just say you are a bitch." "That's all right," Baca already

and Mexican ancestry the caller hung up," said Baca.

"By now, it had become obvious that the window incident was not a random act. It was an obvious attack against the people of Mexican ancestry," noted Baca. According to David Avalos, Professor at San Marcos College, "The racist were attacking the most prominent symbol in the area that personified the people of Mexican ancestry. It is not only an attack against Herman Baca and the CCR. It is an attack on all of us."

It is clear that the heightened level of racism against persons of Mexican ancestry has been heightened by Governor Pete Wilson and his Prop 187 minions with assistance of a few extremist Right-Wing talk show hosts. In one hate filled campaign they have managed to turn the Mexican American population into targets of opportunity for every hate group in the country!

Early Sunday morning, Feb. 17th, another attack was made against the CCR. According to witnesses, this attack occurred at around 7 a.m. The two plate windows were destroyed completely by what appears to be some kind of battering ram. The shop was littered by broken glass and what was left of the office neon sign. Significantly, no printing equipment was destroyed and no office equipment was stolen or destroyed. It was obvious that Aztec Printers was not the target. The target was Herman Baca and all he stood for.

The National City Police Department was notified and Officer Don Smith soon arrived to investigate the incident. He was informed about the previous incident and of the day's attack.

Members of the CCR and neighborhood community gathered at the print shop to render assistance. La Prensa took note of the dialogue between those present. It became clear that they suspected that it was a hate crime specifically aimed at Herman Baca. This was not the first time in the long history of the CCR that Baca had been singled out for vengeance for his stance against racism, oppression, denial of civil and constitutional rights. He was a recognizable figure and symbol to the Mexican American communities of California as Corky Gonzalez was to the citizens of Colorado, Tierina to New Mexicans and Jose Angel Gutierrez to Texans.

"The green light to this type of hatred has to be laid at the feet of Governor Pete Wilson. He led the parade in generating hatred towards our people. He alone made it "ok" to attack, beat, kill and destroy the property of the 30 percent of the residents of this state who are Mexican American. A climate of racial hatred has been created. With the assistance of the extreme Right Wing they have made it an "open season on the Mexican American Community," stated Herman Baca.

Recently Baca was invited to speak at the University of Riverside along with Reyes Lopez Tierina, Leader of the New Mexico Land Rights movement, and Jose Angel Gutierrez, founder of La Raza Unida Party from Texas. They spoke at the "Post Mortuum Conference on Prop 187" that was convened by the Ernesto Galarza Public Policy and Humanities Research Institute. Baca along with Gutierrez and Tierina spoke on the historical role of the Chicano movement in the U.S. and its relations to Prop 187. The conference was attended by politicians, professors, businessmen and students. The event was reported in the pages of La Prensa San Diego. Four

weeks later the attacks begin.

On February 14, 1995, Capt. Tom Deise of the National City Police Department informed the Committee on Chicano Rights that the incidents had been elevated to a "hate crime" category.

SAN DIEGO, CA....We are here to speak out against the intrusion of extremist, racist, terrorist and vigilante groups into an already tense situation at the United States/Mexican border, who evidently have the tacit approval of the INS/Border Patrol.

"These extremists, racist, vigilante groups have declared their intent to roam the border areas, armed, with the stated purpose of apprehending "Mexican" looking individuals."

We are here to state, today, that Chicano communities, from the U.S., will not tolerate or meekly submit to terrorist harrasments, intimidations, or interruption, of their daily lives. Let it be made clear, right now, least any of these individuals have the mistaken idea that Chicanos are going to submit passively; that any action taken by these groups against our people will call forth an immediate response in kind. We shall not tolerate any abuses upon our person, or denial of our human, civil, or constitutional rights, or suffer the arrogance of any self-proclaimed vigilante groups. These are not the 1850's

when racists could, with impunity, persecute and commit violence against a defenseless Mexican population.

15 million Latinos in these United States will not sit idly by, while extremists' groups take the law into their own hands. We too, have learned the lessons of Mississippi and Texas.

For the last 7 years, through the Nixon, Ford, and Carter administrations, we have spoken out for the creation of a just, humane and responsible immigration policy. We have repeatedly condemned the militarization of the border.

We have decried, repeatedly, the human degradation, brutalities, harrassements, rapings, and killings that have occurred on these borders.

We have repeatedly condemned the use of the local police, border task force, and sheriff deputies, in carrying out INS/Border Patrol functions. These actions have only served to solidify the violent nature of proposed solutions.

Long have we raised our voices against the manipulation of the undocumented alien issue to a point of hysteria by self-serving interests. The total breakdown of reasonable discourse has now occurred. The continued insistence of attempting to resolve the undocumented worker problem through the policies of "Control and Containment," implemented by PARA MILITARY FORCES and DOCTRINES has led to its' inevitable conclusion...The breakdown of law and order.

We hold the Carter Administration responsible for its failure to comprehend the problem of Latin Americans in migration, ~~in other terms except that~~ ^{EXCEPT IN} ~~of control or con-~~ ^{EXCEPT} tainment. We charge the Carter Administration with failure to produce an effective immigration policy which is just, reasonable, and humane. We hold Lionel Castillo, Commissioner of the INS to blame for the current situation for his failure and inability to control the operations of the INS, the Border Patrol, or its' officials in the field.

Finally, we hold accountable, the local police, the politicians and the media, who through their manipulation of a serious issue have contributed to the present hysteria surrounding the undocumented alien issue.

As responsible representatives of the Nation's Latino population, we demand the following:

1. The immediate removal of INS ^{District Dir} ~~Regional Director~~, James O'Keefe and Alan Clayton, Director Support, and of any other official that is responsible for the current situation.
2. An immediate congressional investigation of the whole border situation.
3. An immediate meeting of the Carter Administration with those most affected by the issue.
4. An immediate disavowal from the Carter Administration of the INS implied support of extremist, racist groups.
5. An immediate telegram, incorporating these demands, and bearing the signatures of all the responsible leaders of the

State and Nation, will be sent to President Carter.

NATIONAL CITY. National City Chicano Human Rights Activist and National City Businessman Herman Baca today suffered a second attack against the headquarters of the Committee on Chicano rights (CCR) and his business, Aztec Printing Company by unidentified persons. The attack resulted in both large window panes of the CCR Headquarters and his business Aztec Printing being shattered

The first attack occurred late Tuesday night February 7 1995, when two large rocks weighing between five and eight pounds were hurled against the buildings main plate windows. Baca said, "A rock went right through the left plate window making a hole approximately one foot in diameter but did not shatter the whole plate. A second rock weighing about 6 pounds was hurled through the adjacent plate window making a hole approximately eight inches in diameter. That window was not shattered either." The incident is alleged to have happened in the early morning hours.

The National City Police were informed the morning after when Baca arrived at his print shop and discovered the damage. National City Police Officer J. Kenneth White conducted the investigation.

"I was willing to write it off as vandalism by unknown persons until I received two "hate calls" the following afternoon, said Mr. Baca. "The first caller made it very clear that he hated "Mexican Greasers" and that they were out to get them. He made taunting statements in reference to Prop. 187 and hung up." No more than 15 minutes later I received another "hate call". The first caller, it was clear was a young White male. The second caller was an older White male but the message was the same. This one threatening to come on over and taking care of business."

Early Sunday mornig, February 12, 1995 according to witnesses the two large 8 x 8 double plated windows were completely shattered, along with the neon sign, the front office was littered with broken glass and debris. The witnesses were unable to identify the individuals but noted thay it happened around seven in the morning. In neither instance was any effort made to steal or destroy the printing or computer equipment inside.

Community members who quickly came to the headquarters of the CCR were quick to recognize that the attack was not against Herman Baca the Businessman but against Herman Baca the symbolic figure of the Chicano movement which has fought for over 25 years against the racism and discrimination against the Mexican-American Community.

This time Officer Don Smith conducted the investigation for the National City Police Department. No identification of the individuals has been made.

The incident has been reported as a "hate crime" to the telephone company in addition to the National City Police.

Baca is a leader in the Chicano movement since the 1960's and has been in the forefront for the Civil and Constitutional Rights of persons of Mexican ancestry. Recently he was a spokesman at a "Post Mortem" on Prop. 187 which was held at U.C. Riverside University. Baca along with Reyes Lopez Tijerina, land grant fighter of New Mexico, and Jose Angel Gutierrez founder of La Raza Unida Party of Texas presented a historical background to Chicano activism in the U.S. and its relationship to Prop 187.

National City. El activista a favor de los Derechos Humanos Chicanos (DHCH) y hombre de negocio de National City, Hermán Baca, sufrió un segundo ataque en las oficinas del Comité de Derechos Humanos Chicanos y en su negocio, Aztec Printing Company, por personas no identificadas. Los ataques estrellaron dos ventanas de escaparate de las Oficinas de DHCH y de Aztec Printing.

El primer ataque ocurrió el martes por la noche, 7 de febrero de 1995, con el impacto de dos piedras grandes entre cinco y ocho libras de peso al ser lanzadas contra las ventanas de escaparate del edificio. Según Baca, "Una piedra traspasó la ventana izquierda haciendo un hoyo de aproximadamente de un pie en diámetro, pero no estrellando la ventana por completo. Una segunda piedra de aproximadamente seis libras de peso fue lanzada contra la segunda ventana haciendo un hoyo de algunas ocho pulgadas en diámetro. La ventana no se estrelló completamente tampoco. Este incidente, se alega, ocurrió en las tempranas horas de la madrugada.

La policía de National City fue notificada la mañana después de que Baca llegó a su imprenta y descubrió el daño. El oficial de policía de National City, J. Kenneth White se encargó de la investigación.

"Estaba dispuesto a explicarlo como un acto de vandalismo por personas desconocidas hasta que recibí dos "llamadas de odio" la tarde del día siguiente. "La persona de la primera llamada telefónica dijo claramente que odiaba a 'mexicanos grasientos' y que andaban persiguiéndolos. En tono de burla se mofó de la Propuesta 187 y colgó." No habían transcurrido 15 minutos cuando recibió una segunda "llamada de odio." Era evidente que la voz de la primera llamada era la de un sajón joven. La segunda llamada era la voz de un hombre sajón maduro. Ambas llamadas impartieron el mismo mensaje de odio. Este último amenazó con venir personalmente a arreglar el asunto."

En la madrugada del domingo, 12 de febrero 1995, según testigos, las dos ventanas midiendo ocho por ocho pies cuadrados fueron completamente rotas, incluyendo el anuncio de neon de la imprenta. Las vidrieras se hicieron añicos y la oficina central se vio invadida de vidrios rotos y basura. Los testigos no pudieron identificar a los individuos pero notaron que el incidente ocurrió alrededor de las 7 de la mañana. En ninguno de los incidentes trataron de robar o destruir el equipo de imprenta o las computadoras (ordenadores de datos).

Los miembros de la comunidad que acudieron inmediatamente a las oficinas de los Derechos Humanos Chicanos reconocieron que los ataques no fueron contra Hermán Baca, el hombre de negocio, sino contra Hermán Baca, la figura simbólica del movimiento chicano que ha luchado incansablemente por los últimos 25 años contra el racismo y discriminación dirigida hacia la comunidad México americana.

El oficial Don Smith del Departamento de Policía de National City condujo la investigación de este segundo incidente. Hasta la fecha no se han identificado a los individuos que perpetraron esta fechoría.

El incidente ha sido reportado como un "crimen de odio" a la compañía telefónica y al Departamento de Policía de National City.

Baca es un líder del movimiento chicano desde los años 1960 y ha estado al frente de la lucha por los derechos civiles y constitucionales de las personas de descendencia mexicana. Recientemente fue uno de los voceros en la convocatoria sobre el 'post Mortem' de la Proposición 187 en la Universidad de California en Riverside. En la convocatoria Baca estuvo acompañado por el legendario Reyes López Tijerina, Tigre del Norte de Tierra Amarilla, Nuevo México, luchador por la recuperación de las mercedes, los terrenos de los descendientes mexicanos de Nuevo México. También estuvo presente José Angel Gutiérrez, fundador del Partido Raza Unida en Texas. Gutiérrez presentó un fondo histórico del activismo chicano en los Estados Unidos y la relación con la Proposición 187.

HATE CRIME REPORTED AGAINST CHICANO ACTIVIST

National City, Ca. ...Feb. 15, 1995

NATIONAL CITY'S CHICANO HUMAN RIGHTS ACTIVIST AND BUSINESSMAN HERMAN BACA, HAS TWICE BEEN THE TARGET OF HATE CRIMES, BY UNKNOWN PERSONS, AT HIS PLACE OF BUSINESS AND HEADQUARTERS OF THE COMMITTEE ON CHICANO RIGHTS (CCR). THE ATTACKS HAVE RESULTED IN TWO LARGE PLATE WINDOWS, THAT FRONT THE BUILDING, BEING DESTROYED.

THE FIRST ATTACK OCCURRED LATE TUESDAY NIGHT, FEBRUARY 7, 1995. TWO LARGE ROCKS WERE THROWN AGAINST THE BUILDING'S TWO MAIN PLATE WINDOWS.

ACCORDING TO BACA, CHAIRMAN OF THE COMMITTEE ON CHICANO RIGHTS, ONE OF THE ROCKS MADE A HOLE APPROXIMATELY A FOOT IN DIAMETER IN THE RIGHT PLATE WINDOW. THE SECOND ROCK MADE A HOLE APPROXIMATELY EIGHT INCHES IN DIAMETER IN THE LEFT SIDE PLATE WINDOW. THE ROCKS LANDED INSIDE THE OFFICE EACH WEIGHING AROUND 6-8 POUNDS. NEITHER WINDOW WAS SHATTERED. THE INCIDENT OCCURRED IN THE EARLY MORNING HOURS.

THE NATIONAL CITY POLICE DEPARTMENT WAS INFORMED AND OFFICER J. KENNETH WHITE WAS DISPATCHED TO INVESTIGATE THE INCIDENT.

"I FIGURED IT WAS JUST A RANDOM ACT OF VANDALISM BY UNKNOWN PERSONS UNTIL I RECEIVED THE TWO 'HATE CALLS' THE FOLLOWING AFTER NOON," BACA SAID. "THE FIRST CALLER MADE IT CLEAR THAT HE HATED 'MEXICAN GREASERS' AND THAT THEY WERE OUT TO GET THEM. HE THEN MADE TAUNTING STATEMENTS AND MADE REFERENCE TO PROPOSITION 187 AND HUNG UP. NO MORE THAN 15 MINUTES LATER, I RECEIVED ANOTHER 'HATE CALL.'"

"THE FIRST CALLER SOUNDED LIKE A YOUNG WHITE MALE. THE SECOND CALLER SOUNDED LIKE AN OLDER WHITE MALE BUT THE MESSAGE WAS THE SAME. THE SECOND CALLER THREAT

ENED TO COME OVER AND FINISH TAKING CARE OF BUSINESS."

EARLY SUNDAY MORNING, FEBRUARY 12, 1995 THE TWO 8FT X 8FT PLATE WINDOWS WERE COMPLETELY SHATTERED ALONG WITH TWO OFFICE NEON SIGNS. THE FRONT OFFICES, WHICH ALSO SERVE AS THE OFFICES OF AZTEC PRINTERS WERE LITTERED WITH GLASS AND DEBRIS. WITNESSES SAID THE INCIDENT HAPPENED AT AROUND SEVEN IN THE MORNING. IN NEITHER INSTANCE WERE ANY EFFORTS MADE TO STEAL OR DESTROY THE PRINTING EQUIPMENT OR TO STEAL THE COMPUTERS AND OTHER OFFICE EQUIPMENT.

ONCE AGAIN THE NATIONAL CITY POLICE DEPARTMENT WAS NOTIFIED AND OFFICER DON SMITH CONDUCTED AN INVESTIGATION.

COMMUNITY MEMBERS, WHO QUICKLY CAME TO THE HEADQUARTERS AFTER LEARNING OF THE INCIDENT, WERE QUICK TO RECOGNIZE THAT THE ATTACK WAS NOT AGAINST HERMAN BACA, THE BUSINESSMAN, BUT AGAINST HERMAN BACA, A SYMBOLIC FIGURE OF THE CHICANO MOVEMENT THAT HAS FOUGHT FOR OVER 25 YEARS AGAINST RACISM, DISCRIMINATION AND FOR THE CIVIL AND CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHTS OF THE MEXICAN AMERICAN COMMUNITY.

BACA'S MOST RECENT APPEARANCE WAS AS A SPOKESMAN AT A POSTMORTEM ON PROP 187, HELD AT U.C. RIVERSIDE. BACA ALONG WITH REYES LOPEZ TIJERINA, LAND GRANT FIGHTER OF NEW MEXICO AND JOSE ANGEL GUTIERREZ, FOUNDER OF LA RAZA UNIDA PARTY OF TEXAS PRESENTED A HISTORICAL ANALYSIS OF THE CHICANO ACTIVISM IN THIS COUNTRY AND ITS RELATIONSHIP TO PROP 187.

THE ATTACKS AND CALLS HAVE NOW BEEN LABELED AS HATE CRIMES BY THE NATIONAL CITY POLICE DEPARTMENT.





KKK symbols painted at Herman Baca's house

The symbol of the Ku Klux Klan was spray-painted Thursday night or Friday morning in front of the National City home of Chicano activist Herman Baca, police said.

The symbol, with the words "White power" scrawled above it, was painted on Baca's driveway in a neighborhood in northern National City.

A message on the sidewalk read, "Chicano, go back to where you came from (Mexico)."

Baca had just hours before said in a press conference that "Chicano communities from the United States" would not tolerate the KKK's announced plans to help patrol the U.S.-Mexican border for illegal aliens.

Baca was a spokesman for a number

of organizations, including his own Committee for Chicano Rights. Ralph Arreola, a San Diego Legal Aid Society attorney, made the report to police along with other committee members.

He said a threat against Baca was also made over the phone via Baca's father, who also lives in National City. "They told him to tell his son he'd better slow down or else," said Arreola.

Baca's phone number is unlisted.

Baca was not available for comment. But Arreola said he had requested that his address not be published.

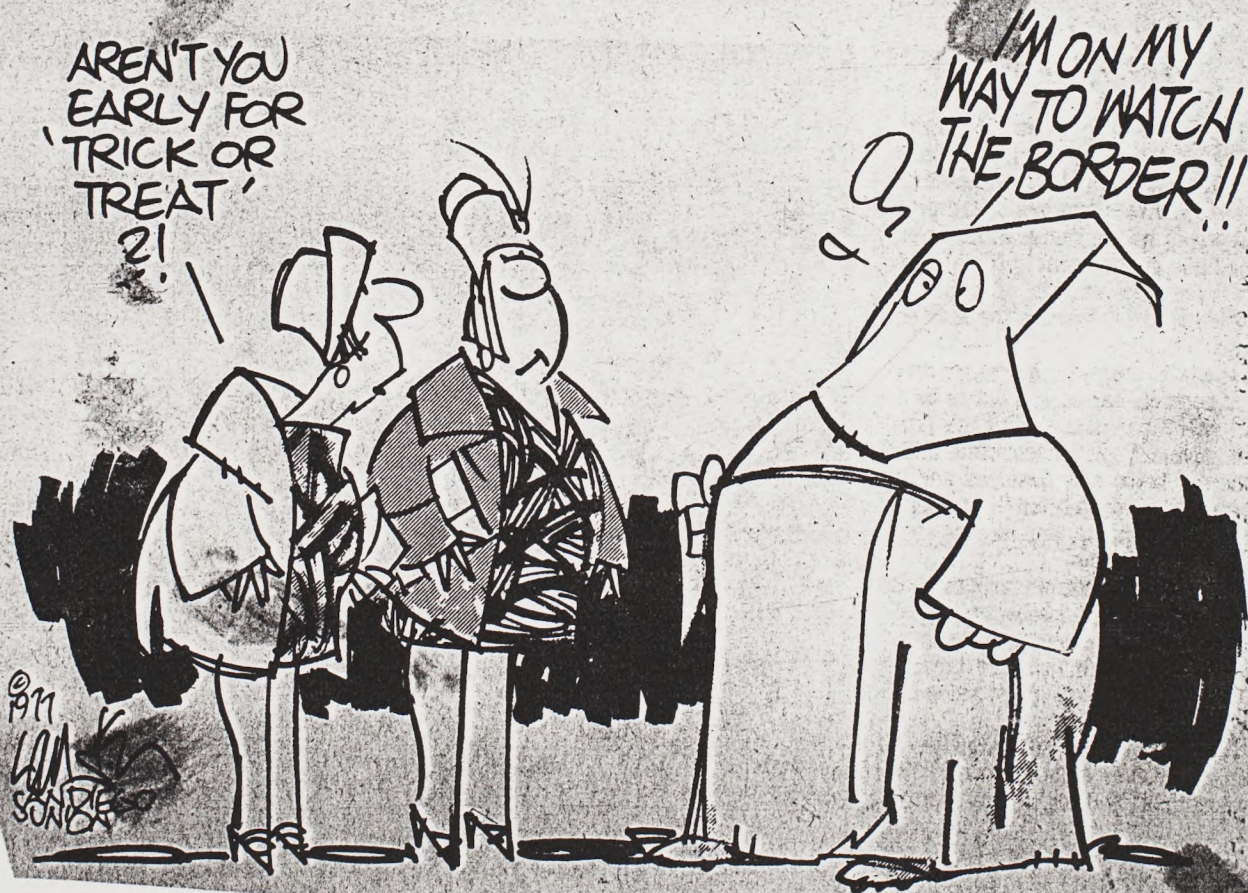
Arreola said Baca had at first not wanted to report the threats or the spray-painting to police, but committee members had talked him into it.

Chicanos Urged To Remain Calm

Leaders of a citizens coalition opposed to the threatened border watch by the Ku Klux Klan urged local Chicanos yesterday to remain cool in the wake of a cross-burning and the painting of KKK symbols on the homes of two Chicanos.

The home of Herman Baca of National City, the coalition's chief spokesman, was vandalized Thursday night. Police are still investigating.

"Let others know that we stand firm," said Jesse Ramirez, executive director of the Chicano Federation of San Diego County, Inc. "Follow us, don't be misdirected."

Several other leaders endorsed Ramirez's plea that local Chicanos should not be provoked by acts of vandalism.

Attorney Rafael Arreola, the coalition's legal adviser, said reasonable steps will be taken to protect coalition members and their leaders.

Arreola also announced plans for a peaceful march next Saturday — beginning in San Diego, crossing the border for meetings with Mexican officials and returning here — to demon-

strate local Chicano opposition to the KKK at the border.

KKK national leader David Duke has announced the Klan will institute a "border watch" beginning Tuesday to help detect illegal immigrants entering the United States from Mexico.

About 80 persons representing 20 grass-roots organizations attended a community meeting held at the Chicano Federation offices to hear the plea for remaining calm. The groups ranged from a Puerto Rican independence group to Chicano student organizations at local colleges.

Among those at the meeting were Clarence Pendleton, executive director of the San Diego Urban League, and National City Councilman J. Louis Camacho. Pendleton told the gathering that blacks are opposed to the "old South in the new West."

Camacho said he despises the Klan's announced presence at the border and urged

the meeting to continue its opposition to the KKK.

Camacho's presence surprised many at the meeting because of political differences the councilman and Baca have had in the past. Baca and others unsuccessfully tried to recall Camacho from office several years ago.

Baca did not attend yesterday's meeting and has gone into seclusion, associates said.

Meanwhile, police are investigating the latest in a series of incidents involving the discovery of KKK slogans at area homes in recent days. A vacant duplex owned by the city Housing Authority, located at 833 49th St., was broken into and the initials "KKK" were scratched into the walls of the home, police said yesterday. Nine windows also are broken.

In San Francisco Friday,

Duke repeated his assertions that the Klan will carry out its own border patrol activities to keep aliens from entering the country illegally.

The Klan leader held a press conference on the sidewalk outside the San Francisco Press Club after he was refused permission to use its facilities.

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Chicano rights activists attend UCR Latino summit conference

They have been a major force in the Chicano movement for nearly 30 years and as the struggle for Chicanos and all Latinos continues, three individuals are still at the forefront in the fight for civil rights.

To some they are oldtimers who are still hanging in there. But to others, Herman Baca, José Ángel Gutiérrez, and Reies López Tijerina are heroes.

Their names are just as familiar to the Chicano community as is Cesar Chavez. All three took an active role at a Latino Leadership conference this past weekend.

Chicano/Latino leaders representing many local, state and national organizations were part of the Second Latino Leadership Summit Conference held last Friday and Saturday at UC Riverside.

Tijerina is known for his struggle to regain land grants guaranteed to in the Treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo. He organized and led marches on the New Mexico state capital. On October 15, 1966 he led the organization, La Alianza Federal de Mercedes (the Federal Alliance of Land Grants), and occupied the national forest campgrounds known as the Echo Amphitheatre.

Tijerina met opposition from the New Mexico Rangers and after a series of confrontations, he was sentenced to two years in a state penitentiary, with five years probation.

Before his trial, Tijerina received national acclaim by leading the so-called raid on the Tierra Amarilla courthouse. Tijerina and some followers entered the courthouse and placed the District Attorney under a citizen's arrest. Soon several people were wounded and Tijerina and his group left with two lawmen as hostages. Tijerina surrendered and continued with his campaign to regain lost lands.

The case against Tijerina was extraordinary as Tijerina represented himself, proved his point, and eventually the jury handed down a "not guilty" verdict.

"Columbia Pictures was supposed to make a movie about the takeover of the courthouse, but I guess someone doesn't want it made," said Tijerina.

Gutierrez, from Texas, founded the Mexican American Youth Organization (MAYO) in 1967 at St. Mary's College in San Antonio, Texas. Gutierrez made his followers aware of the *gringo* establishment

Mayo and Gutierrez soon planned a strategy to effectively impact the Chicano community of Crystal City, Texas (his hometown) and the movement began at the grass-roots level.

The struggle was for quality education for Chicanos. Students were frustrated and no longer would tolerate discrimination. The road to change in Crystal City was long but soon the Chicanos realized that a change could take place and in the spring of 1970 Raza organized to form the La Raza Unida Party (LRUP).

Gutierrez was one of the founding members and with the LRUP, the two-party system with an Anglo-Democrat running against an Anglo-Republican was broken. Gutierrez and his followers reached victory, winning four of seven seats on the Crystal City Board of Education. City council candidates were elected in three cities including Crystal City.

The election made change for Chicanos a reality as 15 La Raza Unida candidates were elected including two new mayors, two school board majorities and two city council majorities.

The school boards were quick to initiate bilingual and bicultural curriculums. Chicano teachers and counselors were hired.

Another Chicano leader who gained national recognition was Baca. He formed the Committee on Chicano Rights in San Diego.

In 1975 Baca and the Committee

on Chicano Rights led over 500 picketers in a protest of the Sheriff's Department enforcement of migration laws.

In 1977 the Klu Klux Klan revealed its plan to patrol the United States-Mexico border to keep Chicanos from crossing into the Southwest because of the KKK plan and Baca led a march again at the forefront. Baca led a march of over 10,000 Chicanos at the border in San Ysidro to denounce the KKK.

"I think the younger generation is educated and strong enough to take over (the Chicano movement)," said Tijerina.

"I think we didn't finish," said Gutierrez. "When we begin to talk about nation building, we begin to talk about the rights of our people to a homeland, we have not finished that agenda. We did not finish because we didn't have enough numbers. We were not a critical mass, sufficient enough to carry a struggle of that magnitude. We are now sufficient numbers, but now we need to carry the message again."

"I would tell young people you have to struggle. There are no victories without a struggle," said Baca.

The three leaders along with the conference organizers will be planning another national conference later this year.

Office of Committee on Chicano Rights Attacked!

National City, Ca. -- Two attacks were leveled at the offices of the Committee on Chicano Rights (CCR) at night. The first one occurred early Wednesday morning, Feb. 8. The second one happened on Sunday Feb. 12, 1995. In both instances damage resulted from the attack by unknown persons.

The first attack was carried out around four in the morning. No one witnessed the act. Two large rocks, weighing between five and eight pounds were hurled against the building's front windows which are approximately 8 ft by 8 ft each. The left plate window had an eight inch diameter hole made by the rock. The right window had a one foot diameter hole made by the other rock. Both windows were severely cracked.

"After the first incident I was inclined to write it off as a random act of vandalism by unknown persons," stated Herman Baca, chairman of the CCR. "The incident was reported to the National City Police in the morning shortly after I arrived for work. N.C.P.D. Officer J. Kenneth White made an investigation and took the boulders that were hurled through the windows."

The status of the incident changed from being a "random" vandalism dramatically



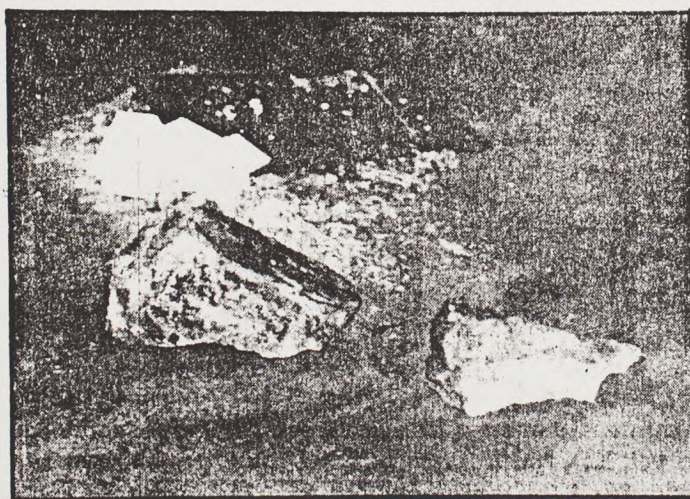
Herman Baca surveys the broken windows of his print shop.

changed at 4:55 p.m. Thursday Feb. 9. At that time, a young White Anglo person called the CCR office. The caller asked if this was the office of the Committee on Chicano Rights? The caller said "I understand you 'greasers' want

to take over California... You wetbacks couldn't take over your own block... let alone California." Baca responded with a comment "You might be right... but I'll tell you one thing... we can take over your racist a--! The caller responded

angrily, "You think you can?" Baca replied: "You called, so I assume you must know where I am. Come on down and find out." The caller then began ranting and raving about

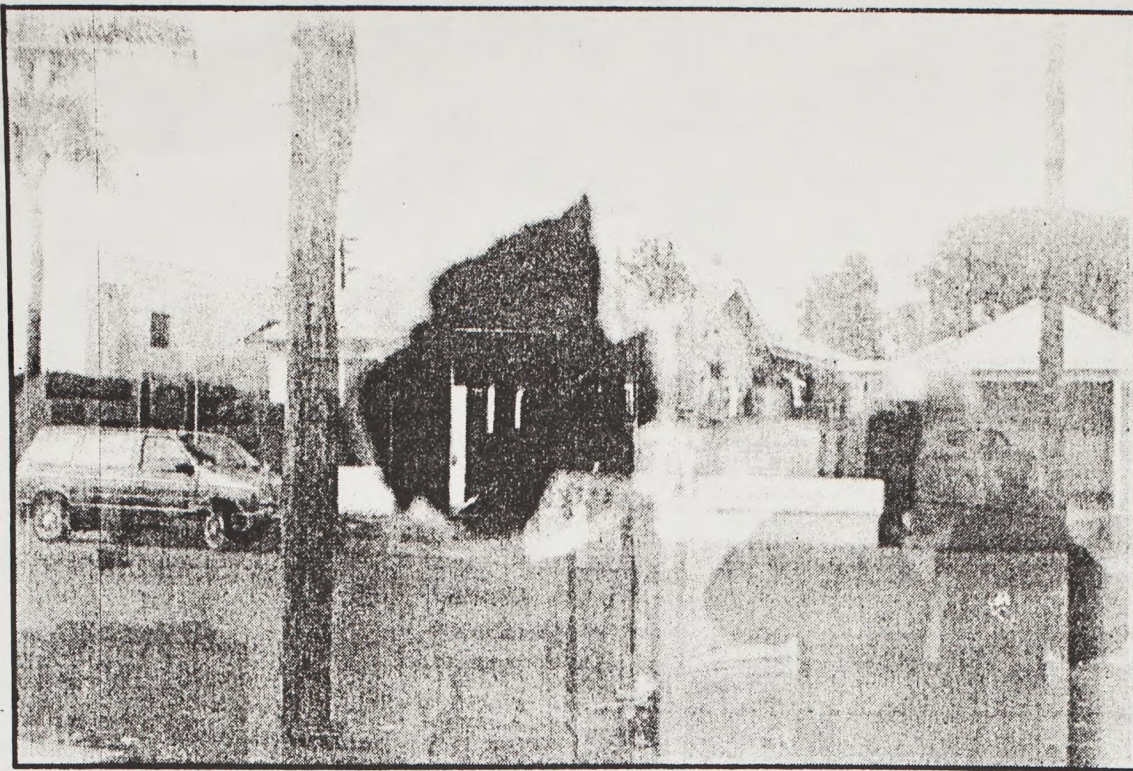

Prop 187 and using vile language and cursing Baca and all persons of Mexican ancestry.

No more than 15 minutes later, another racist call was received. To Baca, the caller seemed older. He also was a White Anglo. "The caller asked if this was the offices of the Committee on Chicano Rights.".... "You bet it is," Baca replied... "I understand you greasers are going to take over California and us," the caller said. Baca, now angered responded: "Why don't you ask your big mouth buddy next to you." The caller replied: "If you think you people are going to take us over than we might just pay you a visit." Baca replied; "Well, it is obvious you already know where I'm... So why don't you guys come on down and don't threaten me." After a few more choice words about my heritage and Mexican ancestry the caller hung up.

By now, it had become obvious that the window incident was not a random act. "It was an obvious attack against the people of Mexican ancestry," David Avalos, Professor at San Marcos College. "The racist were attacking the most prominent symbol in the area that personified the people of Mexican ancestry. It is not only an attack against Herman Baca and the CCR, It is an attack on all of us."

"It is clear that the heightened level of racism against persons of Mexican ancestry has been heightened by Governor Pete Wilson and his Prop 187 Right-Wingers, with the assistance of a few extremist talk show hosts," pointed out Baca. "In one hate filled campaign, they have managed to

turn the Mexican American population into targets of opportunity for every hate group in the country!"

Early Sunday morning, Feb. 12th, another attack was carried out against the CCR. According to witnesses, this attack occurred around 7 a.m. The two glass windows were destroyed completely by what appeared to be some kind of battering ram. The shop was littered with broken glass and what was left of the office neon sign. Significantly, no printing or office equipment was destroyed or stolen. It was obvious that Aztec Printers was not the target. The target was Herman Baca and all he stands for.

The National City Police Department was notified and Officer Don Smith soon arrived to investigate the incident. He was informed about the previous incident and of the two hate phone calls.

Members of the CCR and neighborhood community gathered at the Print shop to render assistance. *La Prensa* took note of the dialogue between those present. "It is clear that this is a hate crime specifically aimed at the CCR," noted Charlie Vasquez. "This is not the first time in the long history of the CCR that Baca has been singled out for vengeance for his stance against racism, oppression, denial of civil and constitutional rights."

To those present it was obvious that Herman Baca is a symbol to the Mexican American community of California, as Corky Gonzalez is to the citizens of Colorado, Tijerina to New Mexicans and Jose Angel Gutierrez to Texans.

"The green light to this type

of hatred has to be laid at the feet of Governor Pete Wilson," said Baca. "He led the parade in generating hatred towards our people. He alone has made it "ok" to attack, beat, harass, intimidate and destroy the property of the 30 percent of the residents of this state who are Mexican American. A climate of racial hatred has been created. With the assistance of the extreme Right Wing they have made it an "open season on the Mexican American Community." he stated.

Recently Baca was invited to speak at the University of Riverside, along with Reyes Lopez Tijerina, Leader of the New Mexico Land Rights Movement, and Jose Angel Gutierrez, founder of La Raza Unida Party from Texas They spoke at the "Postmortem

Conference on Prop 187" that was convened by the Ernesto Galarza Public Policy and Humanities Research Institute. Baca along with Gutierrez and Tijerina spoke on the historical role of the Chicano movement in the U.S. and its relations to Prop 187. The conference was attended by politicians, professors, business-

men, and students. The event was reported in the pages of *La Prensa San Diego*. Four weeks later the attacks begin.

On February 14, 1995, Capt. Tom Deise of the National City Police Department informed the Committee on Chicano Rights that the incidents had been elevated to a "hate crime" category.
