Dear Sir:-

In passing through Escondido, last night, my Road Forman informed me that Martin Leonard, over whose property, your proposed road is supposed to go, stated to him, that he would like to see me in regard to statements that you are making him in regard to the Board of Supervisors having approved the road from Escondido to Del Mar. You also stated to him that if he did not sign up the deed or contract, he would be sued. I wish to inform you that there is no record upon the minutes of the Board of Supervisors where they ever approved said road or map and which cannot be done until such time as the Board has a hearing. I doubt very much, whether the map that you have presented to the Board, will be approved in its present form as there are people, residents of that country, who wish to be excluded from said district. ~~There~~ to

You are filing deeds now, in the County Recorders office and referring to a certain map which has never been approved by the Board, therefore your deeds are recorded under a misrepresentation and the recording of the same will be illegal as they have never been approved by an order of the Board.

I would like to have you appear before the Board on next Monday at 2 o'clock and explain your action in the above matter.

My dear Mr. Foster:

The city of El Cajon has advertised for bids, and they have received a very low bid for the building of 5/8ths of a mile of paved highway, of \$9,000, from Riley & Peterson.

The City of El Cajon voted \$4,000 in bonds, we have raised \$3,000 by private subscriptions and have reached the end of our rope.

The Mayor of El Cajon says he had a conference with the District Attorney, Mr. Utley, who says that the Board of Supervisors can make up the balance, i.e. \$2,000. The bid must be accepted immediately and we have, thru your secretary, arranged for a meeting at two o'clock Wednesday to meet with your board. I am unexpectedly called to San Francisco on a very important matter and it is out of the question for me to be there, but for the general welfare of the county, I do hope that you all can see your way clear to make this \$2,000 appropriation when the delegation from El Cajon and San Diego wait on you at two o'clock Tuesday.

Your early attention and consideration in this matter will be appreciated.
