back we returned our fine Lewis of iron, which is very fine,
into the passage stairs. Thoms & Shaws in the carriage
have to ~~be~~ receive. The 35 sheets of Mr. Rumbold's
papers are left on the land railway left William Johnson
Thoms sent off to Mr. Harboun to the Captain to get
Diller Ladys signed which I will transmit to you by next
post. The estate is now clean. The negroes are healthy
I never had them in ^{total} subjection. They turn out in good tone to their
work which was brought about without any little manner to
the belief, which I entirely attribute to the care & support you
was good enough to give me when last here —
