### What it means to farm workers

Proposition 14 is the Farm Workers' Initiative. Voting YES on 14 will guarantee farm workers the right to secret-ballot elections for the union of their choice.

All workers in the U.S. except agricultural workers have had the right to union elections since 1935. Last year the California State Legislature passed the Agricultural Labor Relations Act, extending this right to farm workers. The ALRA is still on the books, but the funds for elections were bled dry by the unfair labor practices of the growers and the ballot boxes were taken out of the fields in February of this year. Without the money to back it up, the law cannot bring demOcracy to the fields of California. The Legislators, undur heavy pressure from Agribusiness, blocked emergency funding for the Agricultural Labor Relations Board. They said that before the board could be refunded certain amendments in favor of agribusiness would have to be made to the law.

This is too important an issue to be left in the hands of politicians. Proposition 14 <u>insures</u> that the election board will be properly funded. Money for the board that oversees the elections could not be blocked by the legislators.

Proposition 14 will allow the workers and not the growers to decide which union should represent them.

The farm workers need the right to vote for the same reason the democratic system was first set up in this country---because the right to choose belongs in the hands of all people, not just with those with money and power.

But the growers have money, and we have time. We will match their millions with our bodies, our spirits and the goodwill of the people of this state. Califronia is the most nonulous, richest

Califronia is the most populous, richest member of the Union, the Golden State. But it is not yet strong enough to guarantee all of its people the most sacred American right-the right to vote. The Farm Worker Initiative asks the people of California to insure that those who labor in our fields are never again deprived of the right to determine their own fate.
