Dear Mr Fletcher:

Seining Grosmont Lake as you know was a failure and I was disappointed as much as any one, I had asked for a 12 ft deep net and the net was only 7 ft deep of course the fish went under it if any there, I wrote the Commission today asking them to have Mr Shebley refer to his letter of Jany, 30th to you and send the fish (you sent me a copy of this letter) and if possible some crappies and sunfish other than bluegills as lot of bluegills in Cuyamaca now.

Mr Glidden & I have asked the City for permit to go to Morena Lake and catch a hundred bass and some crappies by hook & line and if we get it will make arrangements with Mr Heacock for the hauling of the fish and I think can get the fish all right as they are coming to shore now.

We have not quit yet.

Enclosed is receipts for shipping the net both ways and I paid out \$1. for rope and twine on the net, that is all my expense.

The net was sent down from San Pedro.
