I am sending you under separate cover four (4) mutants of  $\underline{E}$ ,  $\underline{coli}$ , strain  $\underline{B}$ . The original requirements of these mutants were as follows:

B-64 - Methionine or cystine

B-85 - Tryptophane

B-150 - Homoserine or (methionine plus threonine)

B-159 - Niacin (nicotinic acid)
