Tho party of the second part heroby agees to supply all labor and material necossary for lining the flume beginaing at
and onding at $\qquad$ ——of the party of first part, oovoring the inside of said flume from the upper odge of the sides across the width of said flume with $2-p l y$ Trino Ready Roofing by a systom of reinforced lap joints construoted as follows: First, strip of Matorproof building paper or folt shall be mopped with hot asphalt to the bottom of the plume at the place where joints are to be made. The top side of this strip shell bo mopped, thengone side of rooiling shoet bedded therein. This in turn to be mopped and the adjoining edge of Rooing sheet bodded therein and nailed overy two inches or as close as is necessary. The joint shall then be mopped over the nail hoads. The upper odge of the Roofing at the sides of the flume shall be nailed without mopping.

Said party of the second part egrees to prosecute the work with all practicable speed consistont with good work and at such parts or sections of the flume as the party of the first part may request compatable with emonomic handilng of men and caring for thom. The party of the first part agrees to pay to the party of the second part Two Dollars and seventy-two conts per hundred square feet of covered surface. Payments to be by weokly estimates,75\% of the total work comploted during the weok to be paid each weok. The romaining $25 \%$ to be paid within 30 days thereafter.

THIS COMPRACT made and entezed into this twonty-1ifth day of Hovomber, 1919, by and betwoen CUYAMAOA WAYYR COMPMF, a corporation organised aner the lawh of the syate of dalifornia. and having its prinoipal orile in San Diego, dalifornia, party a corporation organised under the lawh of the state of california and having its prinolpal ofifioe in Ios Angelea. california, party of the second part, hereinafter called the COMMRAOTOR,

WITNESSETH: that in consideration of the mutual covenante and promises herein contsined. it is agreed:

That the contractor shall manufacture and $1 a y$ Thirtion Hundred (1z00') Ilneal feet, elightly more or less, of phirtynine inoh (39n) reinforese conerete pipe to replace a finme on the property of the Onyamaca matior company, near EI Cajon, California, with an inverted siphon.
II.

All pipe shall be reinforded with Bright Bessemer zound Steel wire having an elastia linit of 75,000 to 80,000 pounds. The maximum working streas shall be 16,000 pounda per squaze inoh. Sufficient reinforcement shall be noed to withstand the pressure due to the heads shown on the profile. The maximum be used in the said pipe.
III.

All concrete shall be mixed in the proportion of one part of Portland cement to Two parts qi Sand to Three parts of Gravel or Broken Stone $1 / 4^{n}$ to ${ }^{\text {If }}$ ineh.
IV.

The contzactor agrees to carry Forkmen's compensation Ingurance covering all employees of the said contractor on the said work.

The Cuyamaaa Water Company shall. Iurnish to the contractor free of oharge or rental a making ground to be seleated by the Contractor near the gil Jadjnestationgc, and ghay Inyish the Contraotor water Iree of charge under pressure at the said making grownd. The cuyamaca Water Cogpany ghall eucavato, in in Fidth to a true grade and shall do all bacheliling eufliciont to properiy cover and protect said pipe. The cuyamase phtar company ahall commence the excavation of saia tzenoh piomptiy alter the algning of this contrad and anall haje at -aad the siphon 0 laying pipe within twenty day ar the oontraoter, to commenae laying pipe Fithin twenty daye after the date of thia contrane that the contraotor shail in no wise be dolayed in the poriormince of its contract. The ofyamaca water company ahail cauro eind trenoh to be excavated to a uniform width of ifxty-01: it bnoho and shall oause all earth which is ercavated to be dopositha at
a distance of not less than eighteen inohes from said trench and placed on the side of the trenoh Which is opposite to the side most easy of access for laying pipe.

The Onyamaca Water Company shall Iurnish all ooments fol curs sand and graval or broken stone at the making gropnd that is required or 1 s necessasy for the making and laying of said pipe Iree of oharge to said contraotor. The quality of the materials shall be suitable for the work and satisfactory to the contractor. All of said materials shall be fumished by said Cuyamaca pater Company as they are needed by the Contractor and so that the Contraotor may not in any wise be delayed in its mork. should the Cuyamaga water company fail to excavate said tronoh as required or fail to Iurniah any of the materials which it is required to provide by the terms of this contract, the contractor may after service of written demand upon the Cuyamacs Water Company to perform said work or farnish said materials proceed to procure the necessary labor or materials as the case may be and the same shall be charged to the Cnyamaca pater Company at their aotual cost.

## VI.

All pipe shall be made and laid within forty working days from the date of exeoution of this contract, but the time during whioh the Contractor is delayed in said work by the acts or negleet of the Cuyamaca Water Company or its employes or those under it by contract or othervise, or by the acts of God which the contractor coula not have reasonably foreseen and provided for, and by atozmy and inclement weather or by strikes, boyeotts or by like obstructive actions by employes, by labor organizations, or by wars of insurrections, shall be added to the aforesaid time for completion by a fair and reasonable allowance; also any additional time required for extra or additional work ordered by Cuyamaca Water Company. Should the Contractor et any time during the progress of said work refuse or negleot to supply a sufflolenoy of materials or workmen the Cuyamaca Water Company shall have the power to provide materials or wo ramen (after notice in writing giren to the contractor) to fitisish the said Forks and the reasonable expense thereof shall be deducted from
the amount of said contract price.

In ease the work herein provided for should before oompletion be wholly or partially deatroyed by defective soil. earthquake, flood, insurreotion, war, or superhuman oanse which for the 10 es Cuyamaer Fater Company.

The Contractor guarantees that the said pipe and pipe IIne ohali be made and laid in a good workmanlike manner and be free from leaks for a period of one yaar from the date laid. But sald guaranteo, hoverar, shall not ooter any aot or damage to said pipe ifne by act of God or damage or deatruction irom any other danse not due to deleotive material or morkanship.
