1 THIS CONTRACT by and between the Cuyamaca Water Co.,
2 party of the first part and The San Diego Roofing Company,
3 party of the second part, both of the City of San Diego,
4 California, WITNESSETH:

5 The party of the second part hereby agrees to supply
6 all labor and material necessary for lining the flume beginning
7 at _____

8 and ending at _____

9 _____ of the party of first part, covering the inside
10 of said flume from the upper edge of the sides across the
11 width of said flume with 2-ply Trino Ready Roofing by a system
12 of reinforced lap joints constructed as follows: First, a
13 strip of Waterproof building paper or felt shall be mopped with
14 hot asphalt to the bottom of the flume at the place where joints
15 are to be made. The top side of this strip shall be mopped, then
16 one side of roofing sheet bedded therein. This in turn to be
17 mopped and the adjoining edge of Roofing sheet bedded therein
18 and nailed every two inches or as close as is necessary. The
19 joint shall then be mopped over the nail heads. The upper edge
20 of the Roofing at the sides of the flume shall be nailed with-
21 out mopping.

22 Said party of the second part agrees to prosecute
23 the work with all practicable speed consistent with good work
24 and at such parts or sections of the flume as the party of the
25 first part may request compatible with economic handling of men
26 and caring for them. The party of the first part agrees to
27 pay to the party of the second part Two Dollars and seventy-two
28 cents per hundred square feet of covered surface. Payments to
29 be by weekly estimates, 75% of the total work completed during
30 the week to be paid each week. The remaining 25% to be paid
31 within 30 days thereafter.

32 The party of the first part agrees to supply camping
33 and cooking outfit except pots, blankets and supplies and

1 furnishes also the tar outfit now at the upper end of the
2 flume, also guarantees hauling cost from San Diego to such
3 places along the flume where this work is to be done at not
4 to exceed \$3.50 per ton.

5 GUARANTEE. The party of the second part warrants the
6 work covered by this contract to be proof against leaks in
7 excess of 30 cubic feet per mile of flume per year and will
8 during a period of three years from date at their own expense
9 repair all leaks in the work resulting from the flowing of
10 water in said flume.

11 IN WITNESS WHEREOF we have hereunto set our hands

Dear Sir:-

In accord with our conversation relative to a long time credit for an additional car in December, I took the matter up with the Home Office and they have replied as follows:-

"Mr. Hess in his recent trip obtained some strong financial and bonding connections for the purpose of handling the securities of such companies as the Cuyamaca Water Co. We shall write these parties and ask them to investigate the desirability of taking the notes of the Cuyamaca Water Co. for six, nine or twelve months if the Cuyamaca Co. will give us the entire order on these terms. We feel certain that they would not care to investigate the proposition for the amount of one car only. If you will ascertain from Mr. Post, Mr. Fletcher or Mr. Murry whether they would give us the order on the above terms we shall proceed with our parties. We have made it a practice in our company never to take the securities of any company in payment for material."

I expect Mr. G.L. Hess, President of the Hess Co. will be in Los Angeles within a week or ten days and we will be very glad to go to San Diego if you think that there is any possibility of arranging the matter. I am quite sure that Mr. Hess will be disposed to make such fair arrangements that it will be to your advantage to install the rest of the flume very soon and not spend any money on temporary tar paper repairs.

Kindly advise me the outlook at your early convenience and I will put the matter up to Mr. Hess on his arrival.

THIS CONTRACT made and entered into this twenty-fifth day of November, 1919, by and between CUYAMACA WATER COMPANY, a corporation organized under the laws of the State of California, and having its principal office in San Diego, California, party of the first part, and Western Reinforced Concrete Pipe Company, a corporation organized under the laws of the State of California, and having its principal office in Los Angeles, California, party of the second part, hereinafter called the CONTRACTOR,

WITNESSETH: that in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises herein contained, it is agreed:

I.

That the Contractor shall manufacture and lay Thirteen Hundred (1300') Lineal feet, slightly more or less, of Thirty-nine inch (39") reinforced concrete pipe to replace a flume on the property of the Cuyamaca Water Company, near El Cajon, California, with an inverted siphon.

II.

All pipe shall be reinforced with Bright Bessemer Round Steel wire having an elastic limit of 75,000 to 80,000 pounds. The maximum working stress shall be 16,000 pounds per square inch. Sufficient reinforcement shall be used to withstand the pressure due to the heads shown on the profile. The maximum head shall be Eight-five feet. Lock Bars and Tie Bands shall be used in the said pipe.

III.

All concrete shall be mixed in the proportion of One part of Portland Cement to Two parts of Sand to Three parts of Gravel or Broken Stone 1/4" to 1/2 inch.

IV.

The Contractor agrees to carry Workmen's Compensation Insurance covering all employees of the said Contractor on the said work.

V.

The Cuyamaca Water Company shall furnish to the Contractor free of charge or rental a making ground to be selected by the Contractor near the El Cajon Station, and shall furnish the Contractor water free of charge under pressure at the said making ground. The Cuyamaca Water Company shall excavate, furnish and maintain free of water a trench sixty-eight inches in width to a true grade and shall do all backfilling sufficient to properly cover and protect said pipe. The Cuyamaca Water Company shall commence the excavation of said trench promptly after the signing of this contract and shall have at least Five hundred (500') lineal feet of said trench at the bottom of the siphon completed and ready for the Contractor to commence laying pipe within twenty days after the date of this contract and shall diligently prosecute the completion of said trench so that the contractor shall in no wise be delayed in the performance of its contract. The Cuyamaca Water Company shall cause said trench to be excavated to a uniform width of sixty-eight inches and shall cause all earth which is excavated to be deposited at

a distance of not less than eighteen inches from said trench and placed on the side of the trench which is opposite to the side most easy of access for laying pipe.

The Cuyamaca Water Company shall furnish all cement, sand and gravel or broken stone at the making ground (that is required or is necessary for the making and laying of said pipe free of charge to said Contractor. The quality of the materials shall be suitable for the work and satisfactory to the Contractor. All of said materials shall be furnished by said Cuyamaca Water Company as they are needed by the Contractor and so that the Contractor may not in any wise be delayed in its work. Should the Cuyamaca Water Company fail to excavate said trench as required or fail to furnish any of the materials which it is required to provide by the terms of this contract, the Contractor may after service of written demand upon the Cuyamaca Water Company to perform said work or furnish said materials proceed to procure the necessary labor or materials as the case may be and the same shall be charged to the Cuyamaca Water Company at their actual cost.

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VI.

All pipe shall be made and laid within forty working days from the date of execution of this contract, but the time during which the Contractor is delayed in said work by the acts or neglect of the Cuyamaca Water Company or its employees or those under it by contract or otherwise, or by the acts of God which the Contractor could not have reasonably foreseen and provided for, and by stormy and inclement weather or by strikes, boycotts or by like obstructive actions by employees, by labor organizations, or by wars or insurrections, shall be added to the aforesaid time for completion by a fair and reasonable allowance; also any additional time required for extra or additional work ordered by Cuyamaca Water Company. Should the Contractor at any time during the progress of said work refuse or neglect to supply a sufficiency of materials or workmen the Cuyamaca Water Company shall have the power to provide materials or workmen (after notice in writing given to the Contractor) to finish the said works and the reasonable expense thereof shall be deducted from the amount of said contract price.

VII.

In case the work herein provided for should before completion be wholly or partially destroyed by defective soil, earthquake, flood, insurrection, war, or superhuman cause which the Contractor could not have reasonably foreseen and provided for, the loss occasioned thereby shall be sustained by the Cuyamaca Water Company.

VIII.

The Contractor guarantees that the said pipe and pipe line shall be made and laid in a good workmanlike manner and be free from leaks for a period of one year from the date laid. But said guarantee, however, shall not cover any act or damage to said pipe line by act of God or damage or destruction from any other cause not due to defective material or workmanship.

V-1/2

The Cuyamaca Water Company shall deliver all pipe, as needed, from the making ground to an accessible point about the middle of the pipe line.

IX.

The Cuyamaca Water Company shall, as full and complete compensation to the Contractor for the performance of his obligations hereunder, pay to the Contractor the sum of Five and 95/100 (\$5.95) Dollars per lineal foot for each lineal foot of pipe made and laid; measurement to be taken along the center line of the pipe when laid. Payments to be made as follows: the sum of Five Thousand ~~Five Hundred~~ (\$5,000.00) Dollars when all pipe has been made; the remainder of the price of the pipe, as aforesaid, within thirty-five days after all pipe has been laid. Should the Cuyamaca Water Company fail to make said payment of \$5,000.00 when all of said pipe has been made, the Contractor shall have the right at its option to cease work until said payments shall have been made.
