In our earlier correspondence during the last two years, I pointed out to you the aims of our educational organization, its purposes, and its development, which in less than two years pro-

vided for a growth from a few members to about 4,000 in Los Angeles alone.

With the practical application of the new humanistically, reinterpreted scientific attitude - a behavior pattern proposed for humanity in harmony with the sense of recent developments in social and physical sciences - our organization has embarked on a long range project through which the cultural survival of mankind may be achieved in spite of the present socially destructive tendencies.

With survival at stake and with knowledge of social responsibility and the gravity of the world situation, The Humanists believe that their pioneering work along the aforementioned socially applied scientific attitude, which includes the "whole man" (with his intellect as well as his feelings and desires), will be a catalytic agent for human betterment, and will have its impress felt in a much larger circle of humanity than from the mere size of our membership one could otherwise forsee.

With the new facilities at our disposal - an auditorium for 600 persons, a dining room for over 200, and about 15 additional rooms, - we believe that our socially necessary work will be intensified and accelerated to a great extent. Lectures, concerts, social meetings, classes, community work, research, seminar groups, preparation of a larger bulletin, and so on - all this, and many other phases of our work leading, we believe, to a happier and better world, will gain impetus with our increased facilities.

We wish to start our work in the new building with a formal and festive opening on September 24th at 8 p.m. It is important that on that occasion someone of your standing and achievement should give weight to our work in which many eminent scientists, world renowned artists and well known educators have already participated.
