Dear Sir:

Your application for a preliminary water power permit was received May 5.

The application has been found to be incomplete in the following respects: (1) The lower terminal point of the conduit is not tied in to a corner of the public survey, as required by paragraph E of regulation L-10; (2) ~~the~~ complete estimates, as required by paragraph F of regulation L-10, were not furnished; (3) As evidence of water appropriation, you have filed a copy of a notice posted July 31, 1886 and recorded in the Office of the Recorder of San Diego County on August 4, 1886. The notice states that the water is intended for irrigation and domestic use, and mechanical purposes. It is not believed that this appropriation is sufficient to authorize a use of the water in connection with the development of

power, unless some work had been done with a view to using it for that purpose prior to the enactment by the California legislature, of the recent laws requiring a permit from the State Board of Control, Water Power, and later the Water Commission, to use the water for the purpose of the development of power. If you can make a showing, certified by an affidavit, that work of this nature had been done prior to the enactment of these laws, it will be considered sufficient in connection with an application for preliminary permit. However, before a final permit will be granted, it will be necessary for you to file a statement of the State Water Commission that this appropriation made in 1886 gives you the right to use the water in question in connection with the development of power.

I am returning herewith the papers which accompanied your application and the maps are being returned under separate cover, in order that the application may be completed in accordance with the above suggestions. I am also sending herewith a copy of the National Forest Manual, containing the regulations approved by the Secretary of Agriculture on February 24, which you probably did not have in preparing your application.

Dear Sir:

Enclosed herewith is an order signed by the Sec-  
retary of Agriculture on December 5, revoking the final power  
permit which was granted to Messrs. Murray and Fletcher on  
December 10, 1914. The following is quoted from the Chief  
Engineer's letter of December 6, transmitting the order of  
revocation to this office:

"The applicants requested an extension of two  
years to their permit but there was no indication that  
they would be in a position to construct the developments  
for some time. Had there been a probability of their  
starting the construction of the project in the near fu-  
ture I would gladly have recommended an extension. How-  
ever, in view of the fact that the project is a small one  
and that the applicants control a majority of the rights  
of way required for the development, it is preferable to  
revoke the permit. This action however, is taken without  
prejudice to the applicants reapplying for a permit should  
they be able to start construction work. I wish you would  
kindly explain this point to the applicants at the time you  
inform them of the revocation".

This case is now closed in this office.
