Your letter of July 3rd is received and contents noted. I think that you have misunderstood our previous letters to you and we wish to state that the rate we are prepared to make to you people is 11-1/5 cents per hundred cubic feet which is the same as 15 cents per thousand gallons.

You do not state whether the people on this tract will appoint an agent to make collections and to pay this Company in one lump sum each month for the water which passes through the master meter. Please let us know at once regarding this point so that we can get out the bills.

Dear Sir

My neighbor Mr C Wilson had a talk with you yesterday about Water. He says you made 3 propositions. I think there is one of them that we could get to gather on if I understand it.

The way he understands it is that we are to pay 11 1/5 cts for 100 feet up to 667 feet then any excess we are to pay 10% more for use of the meters. I wish you would answer this and tell me if he understood right or in other words tell me what I would be required to pay for an excess of 200 feet or 867 feet in all years. W H Hale

Dear Sir:-

We have your letter of July 12th regarding water supply for the Orchard Villa Tract and the prices to be paid. The proposition I put up to Mr. Wilson was that 10% was to be added to all meter readings to pay this Company for leakage in your pipe, slippage in the individual meters, etc., and that the rate was to be 11-1/5 cents per hundred cubic feet with a 75 cent monthly minimum. This would make any monthly

use of	600 feet or less -----	75 cents.
	700 feet would be -----	85 cents
	800 feet -----	\$1.00
	900 feet -----	1.10
	1,000 feet -----	1.25
	1,250 feet -----	1.55
	1,500 feet -----	1.85 and
	2,000 feet -----	2.45

I believe this will explain matters so that you thoroughly understand the proposition.

We will greatly appreciate having an early decision so that we can send out our bills for the last two months.
