My dear Mr. Highland:

The Lake Hodges note has been paid off in full, principal and interest, as of date of September 1, 1935, with the following exception:

The obligation of G. A. Davidson	\$1228.15
Fred Hansen	<u>1317.00</u>
	\$2545.15

I am enclosing note of G. Aubrey Davidson for his amount, duly signed, and in your favor, all as per our understanding. I have sent his note to Mr. Hansen for his signature but he would not sign it until he saw you. Will you please ask him to sign and give it to you?

It is my understanding that you are to continue to hold the old note for which we are all liable but that you are doing this to assist us in the collection of these two notes.

This represents the \$1000 subscription of each by Davidson and Hansen and the balance represents the delinquent interest which they owe.

Mr. Davidson writes me: "I wish you would say to the First National Bank in passing this note to them that it is not going to be possible for me to take care of this note in sixty days' time, one month having already gone by, and that I will need at its maturity, another 90 days' extension. I will hope at least to make a substantial payment against the amount at the end of the second period." Please cooperate with Mr. Davidson in this matter. Also try to find a way for Hansen to pay his obligation. It will all be appreciated by the rest of us. With Davidson and Hansen signing individual notes, it is going to be much easier for us to collect from them than otherwise. Your assistance in this matter will be greatly appreciated.

Dear Colonel:

Your letter of no date received with check from Mr. Davidson in the amount of \$18.42 to cover interest on his note which you are holding and which you in turn forwarded to us to be endorsed on the note signed by yourself, George Marston, et al.

This is to advise you that we have made the endorsement of the amount forwarded toward the payment of interest on said note.

We are rather disappointed to note from Mr. Davidson's letter to you that he is not in a position to make a payment at this time and while we regard the note which we are holding with the various makers thereon absolutely safe, nevertheless, it is past due and unless there is some prospect of its being paid within the next thirty or sixty days, I would suggest that a new note be given us executed by the same signers as we have on the old note.

As to forcing Mr. Hansen to make a payment of his interest at this time, I do not believe we are in a position to do much in this respect as he also owes us back interest on a direct loan which we are trying to get up to date. I think perhaps your Committee pressing Mr. Hansen


