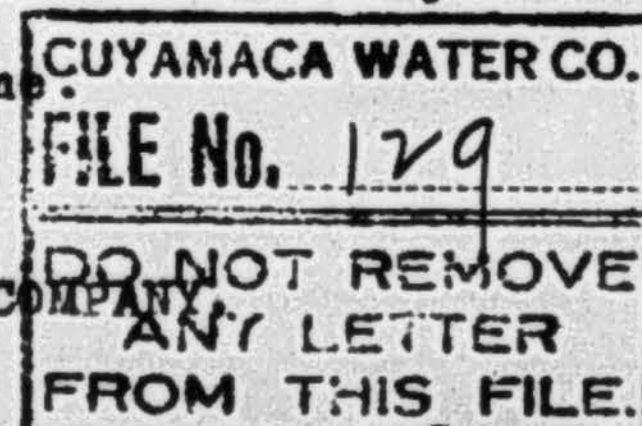
Dear Sir:

Replying to your letter of recent date, relative to a bill for water sent you, for the month of February, 1916, amounting to \$5.40, will say that doubtless you are aware of the damage done to our main flume during the recent heavy rains and floods the latter part of January, causing landslides and large boulders to roll down the mountain sides, carrying away portions of our flume line, causing us to turn off the water while needed repairs were being made. We feel under the circumstances that we are entitled to collect for this month, as consumers would have been receiving their supply of water if the flume had not been damaged. In this connection, will say that practically all of the consumers have paid their bills as rendered, although some have marked their checks "Paid under protest." If you so desire, you can send us your check so marked, and in the event that the Railroad Commission should rule that we are not entitled to collect for this month, the consumers will receive proper credit on their current month's bills, for the amount so paid.

We are returning herewith your bill, and would ask that you send us your check as soon as convenient for same.

My dear Mr Klein:

As you know, when we found that we could not do business with you, we made a water filing on Government lands above you and have secured a permit from the State Water Commission to construct our dam and divert the water. It is our intention to build a small dam at our point of diversion just to divert the water and carry it into another location where we have purchased a reservoir site.

If you maintain your present attitude, of course this means endless litigation. We changed our point of diversion to the reservoir site which you claim under your mining claim. I was thinking that perhaps an arrangement of this kind could be made: that we could be allowed to go in there and build the reservoir on your mining claim up to a height that would not conflict with your mining operations; simply use the same as a point of diversion instead of the one that has been given to us by the Government. It will cost a little less money to build it down below than above the point where we filed. You could not possibly be damaged because we would not flood your mine; neither would there be any conflict about the question of your water rights. It is our intention to save you as well as ourselves litigation by changing the point of diversion and carry out the

idea above suggested, we would not be interfering with your mining operations at all and you could not possibly be damaged, while it eliminates all other conflicting interests. Would your people consider this? If so, kindly let me know what arrangements, if any, can be made along these lines.


I returned yesterday after

My dear Mr. Kuck:

Answering yours of the 20th: I regret
that as I am leaving with the California High-
way Commission in the interests of a transcon-
tinental highway, I shall not be able to be at
the meeting. As you probably know, I am presi-
dent of the Dixie Overland Highway, and vice-
president of the Bankhead Highway, and we are
pushing for a paved highway through Arizona to
El Paso, Texas, and we have a conference with
Governor Campbell of Arizona, on the subject.
I will be glad to attend any meeting, if
desired, later on, but all arrangements are
made and the Highway Commission are on the way
here.

Please remember this: If there are
any objectors, all they have to do is petition
the Board of Supervisors to get out, and the
Board of Supervisors can let them out or not as
they see fit, so those that don't want to sign
should simply be left alone. All you have to
do is to get 22,000 or 23,000 acres signed up
and then let the objectors go before the board
of supervisors.

I am sending the property maps and
ownership maps to Mr. Reid by Mr. Richardson,
who will be at the meeting, as will Mr. Spencer.
I enclose herewith one set of the ownership maps,
as well. Mr. Reid will give you some of the
smaller maps and also a copy of the Irrigation
law which Mr. Richardson is furnishing him.

My dear Mr. Kuck,

Answering your inquiry, will say that before the Board of Supervisors will act, you must get a majority of the land owners, as well as the valuation, as included in the original petition which you now have. When the Board of Supervisors hears the petition, it will have the right to add any outside lands that may petition to join, and it will also have the right to exclude any lands that protest against joining the district, and are included within the boundaries of the district, as described in the petition which you have.

It may be advisable to get out a new petition, and cut out that San Marcos section. I think this matter should be decided at a committee meeting in the near future. I regret to see the delay in organizing the district, for the reason that already Perris valley has signed up 14,000 acres and say there will be no question of getting the desired acreage to secure Warners project.

There is a movement on foot in San Diego also to form a district. I do want to see the water kept in San Diego county, and have been waiting over a year, hoping to see the San Luis Rey water kept within the watershed of the San Luis Rey River, but Mr. Henshaw, in my opinion, will not wait forever. The first legitimate proposition in the shape of a purchase of the system at a valuation placed upon it by the state authorities, and the Railroad Commission to determine the value of power, the revenue to go to the district - said offer, in my opinion, will be accepted.

I have just finished reading copies of the telegrams between yourself and the Union of Operating Engineers and I can only say that I am indeed sorry that you are not representing my district.


In my letter to Jack Tenney, our Assemblyman from this district, which I have just finished, I said in part--
