Dear Sir

We are writing to let you  
know that we do not wish you  
to think that we are deliberately  
putting off the payment of interest.  
Ordinarily business opens up  
about June 1<sup>st</sup> and we had  
anticipated the same volume  
of business as last year  
at that time but an un-  
expected claimant has entered  
into our calculations with  
accompanying disappointment.  
Opening of the new Roosevelt  
highway has cut into the  
traffic here so heavily that  
we have perhaps not more

than 75% of normal this  
season and on top of that,  
owing to the widening of  
Ventura Blvd., traffic is being  
diverted out of Hollywood  
again appreciably reducing  
travel on Ventura Blvd. to  
a minimum; consequently  
business is at an extremely  
low ebb and precludes  
the possibility of making  
the interest payments  
depending upon business  
mainly derived from the  
traveling public.

However, we do  
not wish to give up  
and in order to remedy  
and retrieve what appears  
a hopeless situation we  
have decided to transform

moderate sum for equipment  
and a little time to re-  
arrange our business  
and advertise the fact.

We will very much  
appreciate a reply from  
you before we take  
this step and will thank  
you to answer this letter  
at an early opportunity.

Our regular monthly  
payments will continue  
as usual and as soon as  
resources show the expected

every effort to get up to date  
with the interest.
