
Estimados Amigos y Amigas:



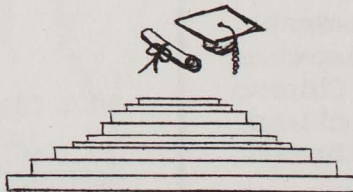

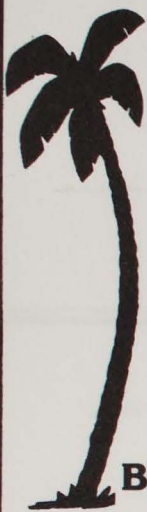
