Dear Mr. Thompson:

It is my good fortune to inform you
that after a talk with Col. Fletcher regarding
your judgement he has kindly consented to pay
your bill for budwood. His only provision is
that you agree to pay up the judgement against
you. He is willing to accept a settlement on
a time payment plan if you will agree to meet
the payments promptly each month.

A settlement of this kind will obviate
the necessity of an attachment against property
whose loss might prove damaging to you, and I
sincerely recommend that you accept this plan
rather than the expensive procedure of an
attachment.

The judgement rendered against you
amounts to \$832.75 including costs. Would
suggest that you mail the bill for bud-wood to
Col. Fletcher at once and at the same time out-
line the plan by which you wish to make your
payments.
