Dear Col. Fletcher;

After days of delay, for which I apelogize, I finally made the rounds of the property about which you write, in the company of a bank employee who is caring for the real estate department of one of our banks. He was better able than I to judge the land values and the figures I am giving are determined largely by comparing with nearby property valuations as he knows them together with checking up through ads, signs offering for sale etc.

Item one: Lot 9 I.X.L. tract, 2 houses. which each face on a street. If lot were equally divided, each place would be worth \$ 3500 or a total of \$ 7000.

Item two. Lots 10, 11, 12 I.X.L. tract. Lots on present day market worth about \$ 6000 each or total of \$ 18,000. The six room house is old and in a very bad state of repair. To rent it for \$ 50 per month it would take more than the house is worth to put it in condition. \$ 1000. is a big valuation on improvements. There is still much vacant property in the vicinity so that the three lots being together is of no added value at this time.

Item three: Duplex house on 20 th. \$treet and Chestnut. This is in a new residential section. Quite desirable. The building is new and cost possibly \$5500. Rentals in neighborhood are around \$50 per mo. for that type. Lot value \$3000.
