Dear Dr. Szilerd:

Just a note, to put on record to protect your interests, about the idea for a window display which you related to me the other day. The idea which you gave to me, being new and novel, insofar as my own concepts are concerned is, as I understand it:

A display suspended in the air by means of a counter-balance due to a rise and fall of magnetic repulsion from a solenoid. The theory at this point is that this rise and fall should be activated by a photo-electric cell: said cell to be activated by a light; and, the intensity of this light to be altered by the rise and fall of the magnetic ball; which, in turn, continues the cycle. It is further contemplated, that a device such as a sword, activated by an independent solenoid, be used to indicate that there is no material connection between the base of the display and the floating ball.

Now it is my intention re: said idea, that if this display is either used or patents are secured for it, the rights for this display shall be vested in you and we shall not in any way use this display without securing your prior permission and complete agreement.
