Dear Sir:

Referring to the application of the Cuyamaca Water Company for a permit to lay water pipe upon El Cajon Ave. I beg to submit herewith, the map referred to and specifications as follows:

Pipe to be laid not less than twenty inches below the surface of the street.

The street surface to be restored after laying of pipe, and all operations, to comply with ordinance No. 9, City of La Mesa.

All private lines intersected shall be taken care of during construction.

Permit is requested for the use of powder when necessary in the trench.

The distances from the center line of the streets asked for is as follows: subject to such slight variations as may be caused by encountering existing lines.

Roosevelt Street: one foot from west boundary of Roosevelt Street.

El Cajon Avenue: between Roosevelt Street and Lookout Avenue; ten feet north of center line of El Cajon Avenue.

El Cajon Avenue: between Lookout Avenue and the Railway, ten feet south of center line of El Cajon Avenue.

El Cajon Avenue: from the Railway to the ~~Westerly City Limit~~ ~~Westerly City Limit~~ Westerly City Limit, ten feet north of the center line of El Cajon Avenue.

It will be noted in explanation, that we ask for the south side of El Cajon Avenue between the Easterly end of Lookout Ave. to the Railway Track instead of the North side as suggested by members of the Council at the last meeting. This is because we find on survey that our existing pipe line is between twelve and fourteen feet north of the

center line in this section, and as the contractors of the trench are proposing to use excavating machines, they object to the liability of the wheels crushing in the old pipe.

The following show the center line of the streets and the location of the pipe to such slight variations as may be caused by encountering existing lines.

General Street: one foot from west boundary of Parcel 11.

El Cajon Avenue: between Roosevelt Street and Lookout Avenue, ten feet north of center line of El Cajon Avenue.

El Cajon Avenue: between Lookout Avenue and the Railway, ten feet north of center line of El Cajon Avenue.

El Cajon Avenue: From the Railway to the intersection with the City limits, ten feet north of the center line of El Cajon Avenue.

It will be noted in explanation, that we ask for the north side of El Cajon Avenue between the Lookout and the Railway track instead of the north side as suggested by members of the Council at the last meeting. This is because we find on survey that our existing pipe line is between twelve and fourteen feet north of the

center line in this section, and as the contractors of the trench are proposing to use excavating machines, they object to the liability of the wheels crushing in the old pipe.

Dear Sir:- In reply to your two letters of Aug. 10 am instructed by the Board of Directors to reply as follows:

You are mistaken when you say that the best bid we have received on bonds was 90¢ on the dollar. The best bid we have received was 100¢ on the dollar.

In regard to the ruling of the Rail-road Commission the same was submitted to our attorney for his opinion. His opinion is that Murray and Fletcher bid in at par \$745,000 of our bonds and that is your pay for the Cuyamaca Water System. I respectfully refer you to paragraphs two and three of the contract which are very explicit and if you will read them through you will find that you are entirely mistaken in you opinion of the subject.

In regard to the suit brought by Judge Boone against the District we will immediately meet it. We do not think he has any case whatever, the organization of the district has been passed on by far better authority than Judge Boone. We think it rather peculiar that suit was brought at this particular time.
