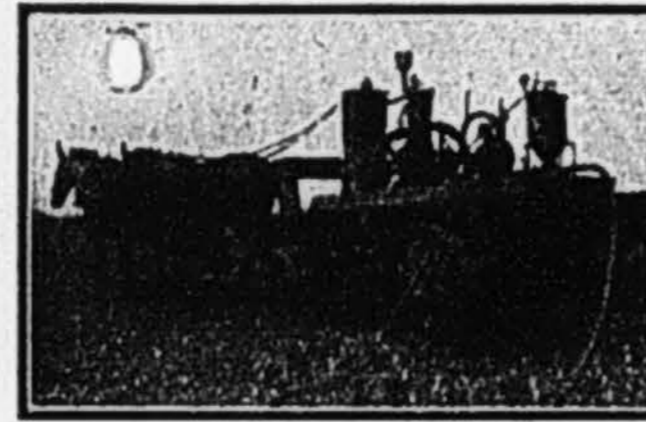

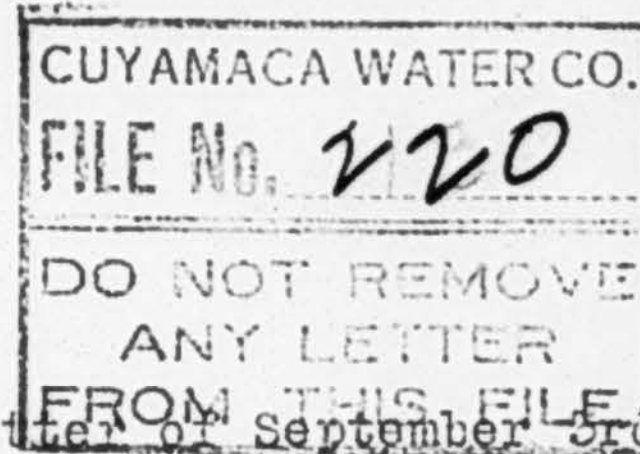

Dear Sir:-

We have your letter of September 3rd enclosing check for \$1.90 for your water for the month of August, but regret that you did not include \$1.25 for penalty for non-payment of July bill.

We return your check and would ask that you send a new check for \$3.15. Our bills are due and payable on or before the 10th of the month. If they are not paid at that time, a penalty of 25 cents is added, and if not paid on or before the 20th, an additional penalty of \$1.00 is due this Company.

We are now exacting these penalties from all consumers as we find that in some cases where penalties have not been collected, that we have gotten ourselves into trouble and consumers have complained to the Railroad Commission of discrimination. It is therefore absolutely necessary that we collect all penalties and we would thank you to send us a check for \$3.15 before the 10th of the month so that no additional penalties will have to be added.
