My dear Mr. Fletcher:- My understanding in regard to
the pipe line is the same as yours.

The cost of the line to the county line was as follows:
To the Pacific Hardware and Steel Co. for pipe, flange
unions & valve, including freight \$87.79 and to the
Cuyamaca Water Co. for laying the pipe 2.25 then
making \$110. We used our own team for hauling.

My dear Mrs. Miles:

Answering yours of May 26th, before me on my return from the East, will say that my understanding is that you are the only person on the pipeline from our main pipeline, and until such time as the Cuyamaca Water Co. has consumers on that line it would not be up to us to take it over. It is customary with the Cuyamaca Water Co., as well as the Gas and Electric Co. to pay on the basis of \$30. for each consumer until the refund is made.

I should like to know the entire length of the pipeline to your house. What proportion of it is East of the state highway on Grossmont property, and in that way we can determine what amount is eventually to be paid you on the basis of \$30 for each consumer, said \$30 to be paid as each consumer is attached to the pipeline until our full proportion is refunded to you.

Kindly let me have this data and settlement will be made with you as above.
