

Accreditation received for the undergraduate program in electrical engineering by the Engineering Accreditation Commission of the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology, Inc.

The undergraduate program in electrical engineering at the University of California, San Diego has been accredited by the Engineering Accreditation Commission (EAC) of the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology, Inc. (ABET).

Announcement of the accreditation was made in a letter to UCSD Chancellor Richard C. Atkinson by accreditation board president Leland J. Walker. The action of the accreditation board was based on an analysis of information submitted by UCSD and on the results of a campus visit by a three member visiting team from the commission.

Electrical engineering comes under the Division of Engineering recently established on the UCSD campus. The UC Board of Regents approved the establishment of the division in June 1981 and appointed Dr. M. Lea Rudee, former provost of Warren College and professor of materials science at UCSD, as dean of the new division last April .

The Division of Engineering is made up of the Department of Applied Mechanics and Engineering Sciences and the Department of Electrical Engineering and Computer Sciences. There are currently 2,618 undergraduate students and 258 graduate students enrolled with engineering as their main course of study at UCSD.
