ALHAMBRA TRACT.

Your attention is directed to the following
RULES ^{AND} REGULATIONS
Governing the Use and Distribution of Water on Said Tract.

1. The Superintendent shall have direct charge, control and management of the division and distribution of water among the lot owners, and he shall be governed by these rules and such special directions as may be given him from time to time by the owners of the water.

2. Each householder shall be allowed one pipe tapping main, for domestic use, such pipe not to exceed one inch in diameter, and all connections with the mains must be made under the direction of the Superintendent, and the lot owner must keep his hydrants, pipes and connections with main in repair. And no person must tap any main or open or tamper with any water gate, unless authorized by the Superintendent.

3. Persons desiring to purchase water for irrigation, must make application to the Superintendent during the first week of each month, and their dates will then be assigned them.

4. The rates for domestic water (as at present charged) shall be due on the first day of each month. The rates charged for irrigating water shall be due upon delivery of the water, and the Superintendent will not deliver water to any person who has not paid his dues in full.

5. The hours for irrigating shall be from 7 a. m. to 5 p. m.

6. Water for sprinkling flowers and grass shall be used only from the domestic water pipe, and only from 5 p. m. to 7 p. m. The practice of tapping small streams for this purpose from the irrigating hydrants, is strictly prohibited, and in justice to all, this rule will be strictly enforced.

7. The owner of each tract of land whereon water is used, whether by himself or tenant, shall be liable for the payment of all water used thereon.

8. These regulations, as well as the present reduced rates, will remain in force until changed by the owners of the water.

The Superintendent will strictly enforce these rules, and the owners ask the earnest co-operation of the lot owners, and the prompt reporting of any violations, and they believe that an honest compliance with reasonable regulations will be for the benefit of all concerned, and render the service much more satisfactory.
