If you wish to be represented, your attorney or representative must appear with you at the hearing prepared to proceed. You can request an earlier hearing in writing.

Failure to appear at your hearing except for exceptional circumstances may result in one or more of the following actions: (1) You may be taken into custody by the Immigration and Naturalization Service and held for further action. OR (2) Your hearing may be held in your absence under section 240(b)(5) of the Immigration and Nationality Act. An order of removal will be entered against you if the Immigration and Naturalization Service established by clear, unequivocal and convincing evidence that a) you or your attorney has been provided this notice and b) you are removable.

[REDACTED] requested and was allowed to return to Mexico on 12/24/98 after being apprehended at the San Ysidro, California Port of Entry while riding in the trunk of a car with two other illegal aliens. He also was arrested on 05/01/90 for Possession of a Deadly Weapon in Santa Ana, California. Again the charges were dismissed in the interest of Justice.

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[REDACTED] was advised of his rights in the Spanish language as per MIRANDA by BPA D. [REDACTED] at 1:58 AM witnessed by SPA [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated he understood his rights and was willing to answer questions without having an attorney present.

[REDACTED] told me he was heading from Los Angeles, California to El Centro, California in order to look for work. [REDACTED] denied any knowledge of aliens being dropped off south of the checkpoint and told me we must have the wrong vehicle.

In the meantime, Agent [REDACTED] had maintained visual contact with the nine persons walking into desert and had directed their apprehension. These persons were taken to the checkpoint for processing. Interview of these persons revealed they were all citizens and nationals of Mexico and were illegally within the United States.

Agent [REDACTED] discovered some personal belongings in the back of the pickup driven by [REDACTED]. These belongings were claimed by smuggled alien [REDACTED]. I proceeded to interview [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] told me he had made arrangements in Mexicali B.C., Mexico with an unknown smuggler to be smuggled to the Los Angeles, California area for a fee of \$1000.00. [REDACTED] told me he and the rest of the group were led through the mountains west of Tijuana, B.C., Mexico to a highway earlier in the day. [REDACTED] told me a short time after arriving at the highway, [REDACTED] arrived at their location in a truck. [REDACTED] told me [REDACTED] told everyone to hurry up and get in the back and to stay down. [REDACTED] then told me they traveled for about an hour until they were told to get out of the truck. [REDACTED] then said they were apprehended a short time later. [REDACTED] indicated to me one of the others in the group was going to guide the rest around the checkpoint but out of fear would not identify this person.

I interviewed smuggled alien [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] told me he also made arrangements with an unknown smuggler in Tijuana B.C., Mexico to be smuggled to the Los Angeles, California area for a fee of \$1000.00. [REDACTED] told me much the same story as did [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] told me the group was guided to the mountains and led to a highway. A short time later, a pickup arrived and everyone was told to get in. [REDACTED] told me he did not see the driver of the truck. I showed [REDACTED] the pickup which [REDACTED] was encountered driving. [REDACTED] identified this truck as the one which picked up the group in the mountains.

Interviews with the remaining smuggled aliens resulted in basically the same stories relayed by [REDACTED] and [REDACTED].

ALIEN SMUGGLER

[REDACTED] was encountered South of the Highway 86 USBP traffic checkpoint as the driver of a cream/maroon 1986 Ford F-250 PU bearing CA # [REDACTED] after having dropped off nine illegal aliens.

[REDACTED] told me he is a citizen and national of Mexico last entering the United States, as set forth above, by presenting to the Immigration Officers at the San Ysidro, California Port of Entry his valid form I-551.

SBPA [REDACTED] advised the Highway 86 USBP traffic checkpoint that he had just observed an older model pick-up truck pull to the side of the highway approximately two miles south of the checkpoint. Agent [REDACTED] reported he had observed nine persons exit the back of the pick-up and begin to walk into the desert. Agent [REDACTED] also reported the same pick-up truck turned around and began to travel south on Highway 86. Agent [REDACTED] requested Agents from the checkpoint to head south and investigate the vehicle.

Approximately ten miles south of the checkpoint, Agent [REDACTED] encountered the suspect vehicle matching Agent [REDACTED] description. Agent [REDACTED] initiated a traffic stop on this vehicle, a cream/maroon Ford F-250 CA# [REDACTED]. Agent [REDACTED] discovered [REDACTED] as the driver and sole occupant of this truck. [REDACTED] claimed he was a resident alien, but had no identification on him. [REDACTED] was transported back to the Highway 86 checkpoint for further investigation.

EWI LAPR

[REDACTED] is an I-551 cardholder apprehended with 7 other illegal aliens who illegally entered the United States through the mountains near Ocotillo, California.

[REDACTED] claims he is a native and citizen of Mexico and is an Permanent Resident Alien but lost his immigration document several years ago.

[REDACTED] claims that he is an immigrated alien as last entered the United States as set forth above by walking across the International Boundary and entering illegally through the mountains with seven other illegal aliens. Interview of all illegal aliens revealed that [REDACTED] showed them the route to take through the mountains and [REDACTED] accompanied them while walking through the mountains.

[REDACTED] is requesting to have an immigration hearing in front of an immigration judge but refused to sign his I-826 for the hearing. Record Checks on [REDACTED] revealed that he has been arrested for entering the United States on seven different occasions : ENFORCE FINS #1771767, from Ajo and Casa Grande, Arizona to Imperial Beach, California. On 08-10-99, he was arrested for Transporting illegal aliens and processed for prosecution and Removal Proceedings. The prosecution was declined in the interest of Justice.

Alien Registration: This copy of the Notice to Appear served upon you is evidence of your alien registration while you are under removal proceedings. You are required to carry it with you at all times.

Representation: If you so choose, you may be represented in this proceeding, at no expense to the Government, by an attorney or other individual authorized and qualified to represent persons before the Executive Office for Immigration Review, pursuant to 8 CFR 3.16. Unless you so request, no hearing will be scheduled earlier than ten days from the date of this notice, to allow you sufficient time to secure counsel. A list of qualified attorneys and organizations who may be available to represent you at no cost will be provided with this Notice.

Conduct of the hearing: At the time of your hearing, you should bring with you any affidavits or other documents which you desire to have considered in connection with your case. At your hearing you will be given the opportunity to admit or deny any or all of the allegations in the Notice to Appear and that you are inadmissible or deportable on the charges contained in the Notice to Appear. You will have an opportunity to present evidence on your own behalf, to examine any evidence presented by the Government, to object, on proper legal grounds, to the receipt of evidence and to cross examine any witnesses presented by the Government. At the conclusion of your hearing, you have a right to appeal an adverse decision by the immigration judge.

You will be advised by the immigration judge before whom you appear, of any relief from removal for which you may appear eligible including the privilege of departing voluntarily. You will be given a reasonable opportunity to make any such application to the immigration judge.

Failure to appear: You are required to provide the INS, in writing, with your full mailing address and telephone number. You must notify the Immigration Court immediately by using Form EOIR-33 whenever you change your address or telephone number during the course of this proceeding. You will be provided with a copy of this form. Notices of hearing will be mailed to this address. If you do not submit Form EOIR-33 and do not otherwise provide an address at which you may be reached during proceedings, then the Government shall not be required to provide you with written notice of your hearing. If you fail to attend the hearing at the time and place designated on this notice, or any date and time later directed by the Immigration Court, a removal order may be made by the Immigration judge in your absence, and you may be arrested and detained by the INS.

1. You are an arriving alien.
2. You are an alien present in the United States who has not been admitted or paroled.
3. You have been admitted to the United States, but are deportable for the reasons stated below.

The Service alleges that:

- 1.) You are not a citizen or national of the United States;

I [REDACTED] want to make a report to sue an officer of the INS.
That on the 5th day of the month of February 2000, he beat me brutally with his baton on the back of my head and my neck that he hurt and later he put me in the patrol car. When I recovered my senses he took me to this El Centro detention center . since then I feel real bad, with a lot of pain in my head and problems with my neck and failing vision, as if objects were moving from one place to another. Strange things are happening to me, I don't feel well in my head. They don't want to give me adequate medical attention.

This happened crossing the hiway 8 at the height of La Romurosa (translators note: on the U.S. side this would be in the vicinity of Jacumba) , at about 8:30 PM on the 5th of February 2000. The officers name is [REDACTED] he is Hispanic and uses glasses.
