This report covers a lot of topics really which should have been dealt more properly under separate headings if warranted for Headquarters notice.

RESETTLEMENT AT WAWOI FALLS - BERUA, USUMA & WAGALIJAI

Customarily the people (as Nomadics) moved about a lot and so now have settled at Falls. GOINOBON have move down to the Strickland within the administrative boundry of Lake Murray. The moves are always caused by numerous deaths which are all salted down to soccary. Seeing that there are now 444 people altogether living at Falls, in is worth visiting by the Government patrols. Altought the area is within the administrative boundry of Lake Murray Sub-District, the petrols ex Balimo would be in better position to visit it am it can be easily reached by river trucks rather than treking from Nomad through uninhibited country. (I t is obviously time consuming).

VILLAGE DIRECTORY '73

Census Division No.9 in Balimo Sub-District lists KASIGI.

This patrol however censused 123 people from hamlets - WASUMA & KESEGI.

The deport from ADC Balimo should clarify this point whether the KASIGI people from his area have moved.

VILLAGES CONSTABLES

As noted Village Constables have been appointed for KOMULA people. This agains will be confirmed on the question of administration of the area as to whom the responsibility lies.

FALLS WITH TOURIS POTENTIAL

The area as have been reported is an excellent site for tourism. River trucks with outboards motors man reach the Falls easily and trawlers can mavigate as far as possible. In addition, the airstrip has been marked out by this patrol and if R.I.P fund is granted it will provide an access to the area.

Letter been sent to ADC Balimo by OIC Nomad to clarify the administration point re Falls and KASIGI & KESIGI. The same applies to the question of appointment of VICs.

The two groups namely KESEGI and WASUMA make up a total of 123 people have settled around the Wawoi Falls. It is suggested that the two groups be included in the Balime Sub-District and be administratered from the Emeti Fatrol Post. The report indicates that Wawoi Falls can be reached much easier and quicker on outboards via the Wawoi River than walking from Nomad which takes 8 to 9 days through alarge inhabited area.

It is most likely that the village KARIGI as registered in the 1973 village Directory for C.P. 9, Balino Sub-District in KERIGI at Wawoi Falls. However this is yet to be confirmed with the ADC Balimo.

Another patrol will be mounted in the Wawei Falls, in early 75.76 presumeably from Balime to supervise the work on the proposed strip race the money becomes available from the F.R.A.L.

Subject: TOMU RIVER CENSUS DIVISION.

The C.B. comprises the fellowing groups: 1) Solyabom; mother tongue, donito, last sensused '72; population 72. 2) Asalibi; Kabasi speekers; pop. 174, 122. 3) Buble; Kabasi; 74 pop; 44. 4) Usume; Orogo, or Kabasi dialect; pop. 174: 43. 4) Wagalibi; Kabasi group; 74 pop; 49. And 4) Kesegi (at Wawoi Relas Magiawora River fournil); Komula paople; initial census of 12 persons. Grand Tital: 453. Census, October. 1974.
Previously, Komula paople were not included in the reports on this C.D. since they were all thought to be resident in the south, under the administration of Balino Sub-District. This persol, however, visited Wawoi Falls because three Kabasi groups, Babua, Usuma and Wagalibi lave rewartled in that area at the request of the Komula lendowners. Degabos Woliti has been appointed Village Constable of Kesegi; he reports that his grap formerly stayed at Uniabs, a short distance south, but avoided canaus (mainly) because they feared that the lecterous carriers from around the Emeti area would lure the Komula women away. Esportedly, patrols ex Belimo have not game to Wawoi Falls us the Komula men had tole officers (ie. I. Relly, '77) that the area south to totally devoid of food as well as people. not go to areas reported to be word of people and food. However, now that a fair number of people live in the Wawoi Falls area 123 Komulas at Kesegi, slong with 136 Kabasi, and over one hundred at Konsite: close to four hundred, total—development is warranted. It is also strongly desired: the "esegi as rell as the Konsite groups asked for chillies, or any kind of cash crop seeds. They would like to learn more Motu and Pings (the Kabasi, especially. More than Twenty Romulamen at the Fall. sen speck but to some degree); and they want the usual things like a school, sid pest, envisioned from a parochial sandpoint. This patrol marked an air strip size about 1 mile north of the Falls (across the river from Kesegi, through thehanlet Wasuma, then generally following a track which goes to the sago place called Kasikura). The site is over 2,900 in length; previously, the people had cleared a swath of shout 2,000. A trader named "Sitib" who has reportedly taken over from Alan Quest who had an unlicensed trade store at the Falls, asked the Kesegi men to mark a strip site a few wouths back (the trader is said to be based at Makap, and is probably Mister S. Seckeld, or Mr. S. Henderson). The men conceiled this fact from the patrol initially, hoping that we would select a site nearer to their current sage sweeps, Saluchi and Samabi, which lie about to their current sego sweeps, Salucbi and Samabi, which lie about 3 hours west of Kesegi. But honesty became the best policy, after we informed them the government would not be interested in building an informed them the government would not be interested in building an airstrip beside a swamp. They all agreed that the Falls would be their combined base or "Headquarters", from which they would carry on foraging and making sago from place to place (ie, in a radius of about 10-15 miles of the Falls). They could even stabilize at the Falls when a strip is built and/or development of any kind is taking place. The area, believe me, is worth developing. Kesegi is a setting which would be appreciated by even the most jaded traveler. The Falls, measuring about 150' in width and about 150+' in depth, spifl into a pool over five hindred feet wide and a thousand feet long -ideal for swimming, fishing, any water sports. The area is ripe for tourism, according social, political development and -as demonstrated for resettlement.
