I M HAPPY TO REPORT THAT 1,703 PFRRONS SIGNED_THE PHTITION
REQUESTING THAT THE 160-ACRES LTMITATION PHR PERSON_BE ENFORCED IN
INPERTAL COUNTY OF C.ILIFORNIA.
To get this large number of persons to vote for enforcement of the U.S. Reclamation Law was a tremendous aohievement which you will realize after I describe the methods USkD BY THE BIG FARM INTERUSTS AND ABSENTEE LANDOWNERS TO FOOL THE POPUTACE.

To give you a birdseye view of the situation, I give you the Iollawing baokground:

Imperial County is 5 th in rank as to the yearly value of its agrioultural products oonsidering all the oounties of the U.S. This is all due to the control of the Colorado River by Federal Reclamation Projects. The total acreage involved is about 500,000 acres with a TOTAE VAIUE OF ABOUT \$500 MILIICNS. YOu can therefore see that the big farm interests and the absentee landowners are not going to give up this prize without a bitter struggle. They own $90 \%$ of the land.

If the 160-acres limitation were enforced, a husband and wife would be able to farm 320 acres. Since the growing season here is continuous for 12 months, you can see that the produotion would be more here for a husband and wife combination than in the Midwest. Here $2 \frac{1}{2}$ croos are giown to the Midwest's 1 besause of the 12 month growing season. Therefore, because of this facior alone, a husband \& wife here have the equivalent of a 800 acres farm as oompared to the kidwest 320.

- Because of the better control of the water supply to tha crops and because of the legs variable weather here, the ground is more pro-, duotive than in the Midwest or in the Southeast. For example where the Southrast gets a bale of cotton per acre, here $2 \frac{1}{2}$ bales per acre is the rule. When this factor of productivity is considered, the 320 acres becomes 800 acres. Therefore, a hasband ic wife here with an astual land acreage of 320 acres when the time factor of a growing season of 12 months and the productivity of the ground are taken into consideration, HAVE A FARM THE EGUIVALENT OF 1,600 AGRES IN THE MIDWEST OR SOUTH.

A person farming 160 aores here by the same reasoning, would have the equivalent $0{ }^{\prime \prime}$ a 800 anres farm of the Midwest or South.

By any standard, you can see that with the enforcement of the 160 -acres limitation of the $\mathrm{U}_{\mathrm{a}} \mathrm{S}$. Reclanation Law, that a single person or a family would be able to make a living IF THEY WERE NOT SGUEEZZMD OUM BY B.TG CORPOPATYON FARMS.

The recent U.S. Agrioultural Census of 1959 shows that 1,600 small farms have been forced out of business by the big corporation famms. IF THE 160-ACREG LIMTTATION IS NOT SOON ENFORCED, THE RENATNING 200-300 SMALL FARVIAFIS WILI ALI BR SGUKHEED OUT. THey have $10 \%$ or the raimland.

You and about 1,000 others in Washington, D.C. like Senators, Representatives and other oficicials received my Nevsleticers entieted, HOW THE CMALL FARMERS WERE BETRAYED and SAVE THE LITTTLE FAFMERS BY VOTING FOR BERT YRLLKN. President Kennedy and his staff have the Leaflets.

These home made leaflets were distributed by me personajly, person to person, in Imperial County. NOBODY WOULD HHKP ME IN TES DISTRIBUTION OF THESE LRAFLETS BECAUSE THEY WERE AFRAID:: $:$ Tnis was

THE ONLY WAY THAT THE VOTERS OF IMPERIAL COUNTY COULD BE INFORMED THAT I WAS PURPOSELY RUNNING FOR ASSESSOR-COL工ECTOR OF THE IMPERIAL IRRIGATION DISTRICT AS A STRATEGEM TO GIVE THE PEOPLE A CHANCE TO GIVIA THEIR OPINION AS TO WHEXHGR THEY WANTIO-THE 160-ACRES LILITATION PER PERSON ENFORCED.

THE LOCAL NEWSPAPERS WOULD NOT PRINT MY PLATFORM. THE SAN DIEGO UNION WHIGH HAS AN IMPERIAL VALLEY SECTION, ALSO DID NOT PRINT IT.

A complote CURTAIN OF SILENCR was set up by the newspapers to provent the voters from learning that a vote for Yellon meant a vote for the enforcement of the 160-acres limitation of the U.S. Reclamation Law.

The platforms of AL工 THE OTHER CANDIDATES WERE PRTNTED IN THE NEMSPAPEPS. The incumbent Assessor-Colleotor of oourse made no mention of the 160 -aores limitation issue in his platform.

There are 4 radio stations and one television station here. NONE OF THEM MADE ANY NEWSCAST ABOUT THE PLATFORM THAT I WAS RUNNING ON.

There was a complete NEWS BLACKOUT just as is seen in countries under a DICTATORSEIP. Only my Newsletters told about the 160-acres limitation.

I do no belong to any organization like the Masons, Knights of Columbus, Elks, or service clubs like Rotary, Kiwanis, Lions, eto, eto. Iet despite the fact that the towns are decaying because the little farmers are being squeezed out and THERLFORE CAN NOT BUY IN THE TOWNS, NOT ONE OF THESE ORGANIZATIONS INVITED ME TO SPEAK BEFORE THEM. Yet the serious economic depression of the towns is the PARAMOUNT SITUATMOS here. TPAR OF THE DIGCATORSHIP OF THE BTG PARMERS AND ABSENTEE LAND OVNTRRS IS JUST AS GREAT HERE AS IN THE LATIN-AMERICAN COUNTRTMS Where the "Alliance for Progiess" is trying to get some farmland into the hands of the little people. THE LITHE PEOPLII HERE ALSO WANTS SOME FARILAND.

But the climax of the activities by the big landowners to fool the people came on election day. Enclosed are the Brawley News and the E1 Centro IMPRRIAL VALLEY FRESS. They are the only newspupers printed daily in Inperial Valley. inuxray ivorais who is the publioity man for the BJG REPUBLICAIS WHO ARE TIIE BIG LANTONNEPS AND BIG FARNEPS, had this headilne printed across the top of the zront page of both papers in 1 inch letters. It came out on Election Day, Fob. 5, 1953. Hero it is:

> BFAMLEY CITY COUNCIL CIIVSURES

DR. BEN YELLEN FOR "UNTRUTMES"
Further down in smaller letters(although they still are larger than print), is: COUNCIL MEMBERS CHARG YELJEN CONTINUES TO FLAUUVT THE JAAF.

Most newspaper readers only have time to read headlines so that you can imagine the effeot on the TOters. IT IS IMPOFTANT TO NOTS THAT
 1ÓO-AGRES SITUAYION.

This SMEAR CAMPAIGN was also taksn up by the 4 radio stations and the television station so that in their socalied newseasts whioh come out at least every horr, the listener would hear this refrain, "UR. YRLI, WN TELIS LIES. HE VIGLADHE LAW". BIIt tne smear cempaign douid not fool the people to whon I Lad dietributed my Nowslotters inder shoh great dicisoulor and in limited quontiks as onpared to the smear Campaign conducted by the big landowners and big famons.

The voters, 1,703 of them, signed the petition for enforcement of the 160 -acres limitation. My opponent, the inoumbent, who of voures is a trained assessor ard liconsed appraiser. got 4,542 voter on his plat.fom that he is trained for his job.

There is no question in my mind that if the NENS BTACKOUR and SHEAR OAMPATGR had not been pulled THAT MANY MORT VOIERS WOULD HAVE STCNED FOR THE 160-ACRES LIMTTATION. TLe little people have spoiten Jespite the DICTATORSHIP here. TLIASE ENWORCE THE U.S. RECLAMATTCN IAW.
