

N SAN DIEGO and its suburban territory, progressive, attractive and growing towns there are numerous trips to be enjoyed to places of in-

terest---all of them conveniently reached by electric, motor car or steam lines at small expense. There are no rail or combination rail and auto trips that should be overlooked by any visitor desirous of spending time in this vicinity to the best advantage, reaping full pleasure of a sojourn in San Diego County.

The entire city, beaches and suburban towns are splendidly served as to transportation facilities by the San Diego Electric Railway, San Diego & South Eastern and the San Diego & Arizona Railway Companies; the latter now rapidly completing construction of line which will give through service between San Diego and the East.

At present an exellent daily service is maintained by the S. D. & A. Railway Company to Tia Juana, a daily train also operating between San Diego Union Depot and Tecate, Old Mexico, and Campo, mountain resort. At the last named point direct connection is made with auto stage for Imperial Valley.

I Encanto, Lemon Grove, La Mesa, El Cajon, Grossmont and Santee are served by the S. D. & S. E. Railway Company motor cars on frequent schedule. Electric cars from 3rd and Broadway make connection with ten outgoing and incoming daily trains at Cuyamaca depot. Auto stage connection at El Cajon for valley points and at Santee for Lakeside and other points in back country.

Through motor car service soon to be inaugurated from Union Depot on Broadway.

Round Trip 15c

Take car 9 on Broadway at 3rd to ferry. Car on Coronado side direct to Hotel del Coronado, Tent City or Country Club. Also Marsh's Japanese Garden.

OCEAN BEACH

Round Trip 25c

Take OB car at 4th and Broadway. Passes Point Loma Country Club. Connects with car for Mission Beach, La Playa, Roseville and auto (via loop line) for Theosophical Headquarters, Pt. Loma.

MISSION CLIFF GARDENS


Round Trip 10c

Take car 1 north on 5th to terminus--gardens and ostrich farm. Connects with Adams Avenue car for Normal Heights and Kensington Park.

CHULA VISTA (Pretty View)

Round Trip 30c

Take Chula Vista through car at 3rd and Broadway. Passes potash plant, Savage Tire Factory, National City, through lemon belt, packing houses and immense acreage of citrus groves.



RAMONA'S MARRIAGE PLACE

Round Trip 10c

Take car 5 west on Broadway at 3rd to Old Town, location of first white settlement. The first mission established here in 1769. Historical Museum and Illustrated Lectures.

GROSSMONT PANORAMIC TRIP

Round Trip \$1.00

By motor car to La Mesa, auto to summits of Mt. Nebo and Grossmont. Includes dinner. A tour of remarkable scenic interest, passing through an attractive section of County. Three trips daily.

CLOVER LEAF TRIP

Round Trip \$1.00

Take OB car at 4th and Broadway. Trolley, auto and steamer ride. Ocean Beach, Sunset Cliffs, Point Loma, Roseville, passing Aviation Camp, North Island. 9:40 a. m., 2:20 p. m.

TIJUANA AND RACE TRACK

Round Trip 50c

Take car 2 on Broadway to Union Station. Trains on frequent schedule to Tijuana. Also for Tecate, Old Mexico, Campo, mountain resort, connecting with auto stage for Imperial Valley points.
