PROGRAM TO HELP COMMUNITY COLLEGE STUDENTS TRANSFER TO UCSD OFFERED

Community college students interested in transferring to the University of California, San Diego are invited to attend informational workshops on the Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG) Program at five community colleges this month and in December.

The TAG program is offered by the community colleges in San Diego and Imperial counties to facilitate the transfer process for students who want to begin their undergraduate coursework at a community college and complete it at UCSD.

The workshop will be held at the following campuses:

Imperial Valley College, Nov. 15, 11 a.m. to 1 p.m.; MiraCosta College, Nov. 22, noon to 3 p.m.; Palomar College, Nov. 28, 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.; Mesa College, Nov. 30, 9 a.m. to noon, and Miramar College, Dec. 5, 1 to 3 p.m.

To qualify for TAG, students must meet the following requirements:

1. Meet minimum eligibility for UC admission as a transfer student, including 56 UC-transfer units.
2. Earn a minimum grade-point average of 2.4.
3. Clear all subject omissions/deficiencies in English and mathematics courses.
4. Complete all TAG core courses for general education with grades of "C" or better.

Representatives from UCSD and the host college will be present to answer questions.
