Notice to Contractors.

The Board of Directors of the Linda Vista Irrigation District of the County of San Diego, State of California, will receive sealed proposals in duplicate for the construction of a rock fill dam at the lower end of Pamo valley, on the Santa Ysabel river, in the County of San Diego, State of California, and to clear the reservoir site back of the dam up to the 150 foot contour, said reservoir to be cleared, and said dam to be built in accordance with the plans and specifications on file in the office of the said District.

Also proposals for the construction of the main conduits from the above referred to dam to a point in Section sixteen (16), Township fifteen (15), south, Range two (2), west, S. B. B.-M.

The said conduits are as follows: about 13 miles of paved ditch; about 3 miles of redwood flume; about 2 miles of 42 inch dia. wood pipe in trench; about $9\frac{1}{4}$ miles of 42 in. dia. wood pipe on saddles; about 10,000 lin. ft. 36 in. dia. wood pipe on saddles; about 8,480 lin. ft. 30 in. dia. wood pipe on saddles; about 5,600 lin. ft. 36 in. dia. wrought iron pipe in trench; making a total of about 31 6-10 miles of conduits. The above conduits to be constructed in accordance with the plans and specifications on file in the above referred to office.

Said proposals to be received at the office of said Linda Vista Irrigation District, situate at Moreno, in the said district, (P. O. address, Room 35 Lawyer's Block, San Diego, Cal.) until the 6th day of April, 1897, at 10 o'clock a.m. of that day, when said proposals will then and there be opened at said hour on said day.

Plans and specifications of said dam and said conduits may be seen at the said office until 10 o'clock a.m. of said 6th day of April, 1897.

Printed blank forms for the proposals can be had upon application to the Board of Directors at the said office.

A written guaranty will be required that within ten days after the notification of the acceptance of any of the proposals by the Board of Directors, that a contract will be entered into in accordance with such proposals, and said guaranty must accompany the proposal.

Any person or persons to whom a contract may be awarded shall enter into a bond with good and sufficient sureties to be approved by the Board of Directors, and payable to said district for its use, for twenty-five per cent of the amount of said contract price, conditioned for the faithful performance of said contract.

The contract will be let to the lowest responsible bidder, but the Board of Directors reserves the right to reject or accept any and all bids.

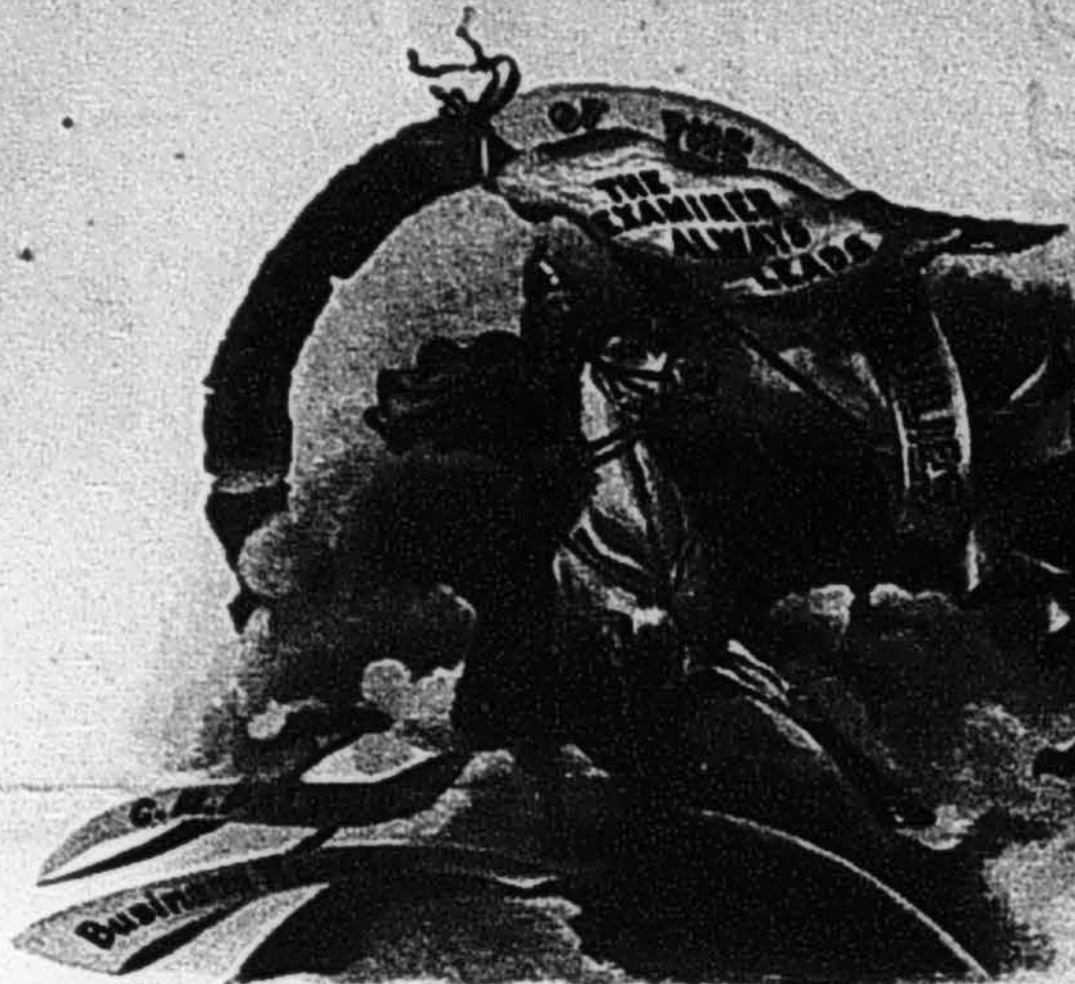



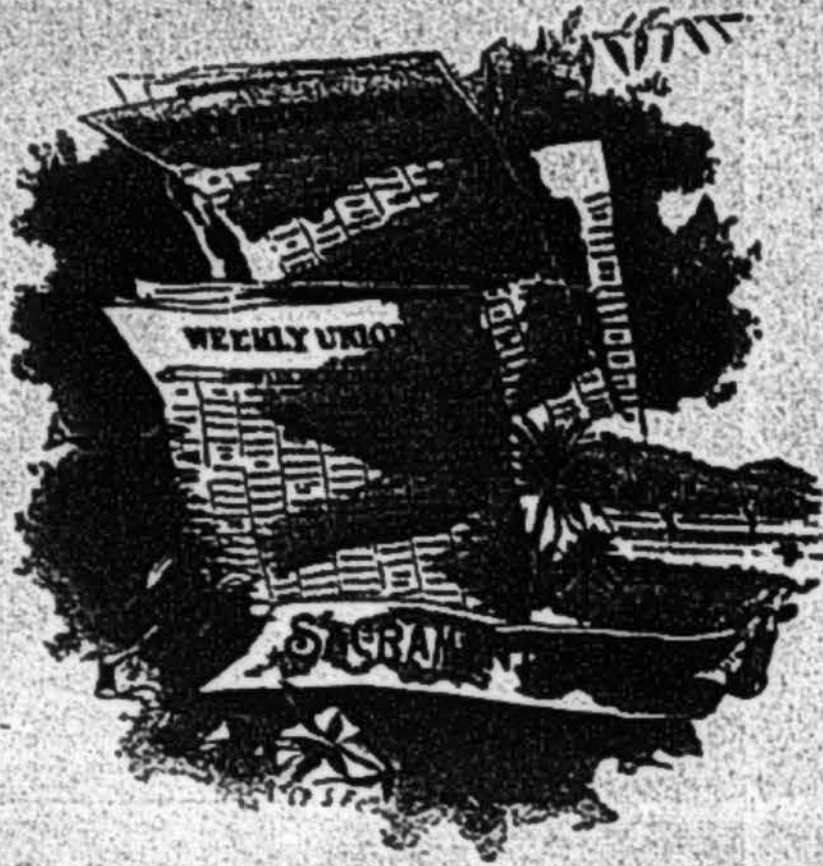
