UCSD STUDENT RECEIVES STATE DEPARTMENT FOREIGN AFFAIRS FELLOWSHIP

Julie Chung, a University of California, San Diego student and a resident of Huntington Beach, CA has received a U.S. Department of State Foreign Affairs Fellowship.

Chung, a junior majoring in political science with a minor in Japanese studies and history at UCSD's Fifth College, is one of only seven fellows selected nationally and the only student chosen from a West Coast university. The fellowship will cover her junior and senior year college expenses, an internship with the Department of State, and a special Summer Institute on public policy and international affairs.

The program, administered by The Woodrow Wilson National Fellowship Foundation, prepares students to enter a foreign service career through professional preparation and the attainment of a master's degree. Participants who successfully complete their undergraduate and graduate studies, the Summer Institute, and the Summer Internship program, will be appointed as foreign service officers.

This summer, Chung is participating in the six-week Summer Institute held in Princeton, New Jersey. The Summer Institute curriculum includes training in economics, mathematics, and policy analysis, with an emphasis on communication skills. Extracurricular activities will include noted guest speakers from the worlds of public policy and international affairs.
