

Harry Scheiber awarded research grant by Project '87

Harry Scheiber, professor of history at the University of California, San Diego, has been awarded a research grant by Project '87, a research program jointly sponsored by the American Historical Association and the American Political Science Association.

The grant, which supplements a fellowship awarded to Scheiber recently by the Rockefeller Foundation, is for his studies of federalism and American legal development.

Author of two monographs on the history of federalism, Scheiber has been professor of American history at UC San Diego since 1971. He has been both a Guggenheim Fellow and a Fellow of the Center for Advanced Study in the Behavioral Sciences, and he has been an advisor to the Social Science Research Council and the U.S. Advisory Commission on Intergovernmental Relations.

The Ford Foundation and the Mellon Foundation are among the organizations funding Project '87. The program takes its name from the coming U.S. Constitutional bicentennial in 1987, and it sponsors scholarly studies of American legal theory and the American constitutional tradition.
