

Dr. George Mandler to be Prof. of Psychology and Chairman of the Department

Dr. George Mandler, Professor of Psychology at the University of Toronto, has accepted appointment as Professor of Psychology and Chairman of the Department at the University of California, San Diego, it has been announced by University President Clark Kerr and San Diego Chancellor John S. Galbraith.

Dr. Mandler's appointment will become effective July 1, 1965.

Dr. Mandler served as Psychologist at the Clifford W. Beers Guidance Center in New Haven, as Assistant Professor and later as Lecturer and Research Associate at Harvard University, and as a Visiting Research Fellow at Yale University before moving to the University of Toronto in 1960. He served as a Fellow at the Center for Advanced Study in the Behavioral Sciences in 1959-60.

Dr. Mandler, who was born in Vienna, received a B.A. degree (cum laude) in psychology from New York University in 1949. He received an M.S. degree in psychology from Yale University in 1950 and a Ph.D. from Yale in 1953.

He is a member of Phi Beta Kappa, a Fellow of the American Psychological Association, a Fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, and a member of the Society for Psychophysiological Research and the American Association of University Professors.

In 1958 he received a special research award from the Social Science Research Council.

Dr. Mandler has written or contributed to four books and over 35 articles on psychology. Last year he served as editor for the Perspective in Psychology series published by John Wiley and Sons, Inc.

For the past two years he has served as a member of the Associate Committee on Experimental Psychology of the National Research Council of Canada.
