

All-University Spring Festival will be attended by nine students from UCSD, April 6-9

An All-University Spring Festival-- with activities ranging from a Haydn opera to Graeco-Roman wrestling-- will draw nine students from the University of California's San Diego campus to UCLA, April 6-9.

Students and faculty from the six other campuses of the University will participate in the four-day events which includes the All-University Art Festival, a Sports and Student Activities Festival, and a gathering of the Graduate Academy of Arts and Sciences.

Invitations to the Art Festival from Chancellor Herbert York have been extended to chemistry students Johanna Hanson and Michael Parris, and biology students John Chalmers and Dan Morris, plus faculty representative V. Rama Murthy, Assistant Professor of Earth Sciences.

Physics students Max Luming and Sharashchandra Patil, and biologist Samuel Kaplan will present scientific papers at the meeting of the Graduate Academy.

Physicist Laurence Campbell will compete in a fencing tournament, and oceanographer Anthony Bowen will enter a three-day chess tourney.

The Art Festival is a showplace for creative work accomplished in many disciplines within the University. UCSD delegates will act as "observers" since classes in the arts have not been established on the San Diego campus. Delegates from other campuses will represent the fields of fine arts, design art, dance, drama, music, creative writing, architecture, motion pictures, and television.

Some 50 papers based on completed research in the sciences and humanities will be presented at the Graduate Academy. Luming's paper is entitled "Application of N/D Method to the Yukawa Potential Problem." Patil's topic will be "Energy Dependence of Proton Electromagnetic Form Functions." Kaplan will discuss "CRM Negative Mutants at the td Locus of Neurospora, crassa." Representative papers will be published at the conclusion of the Academy Session.

Campbell, who took up fencing as a recreational activity while an undergraduate student at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, will participate in various fencing demonstrations. Bowen will compete in "round-robin" chess competition, a match-play tourney, and a chess workshop.
