

Photographic exhibition by Katherine Tingley at UCSD

An exhibit of historical and modern photographs depicting Californian utopian communities including Katherine Tingley's Point Loma Theosophical community will be exhibited August 17-19 in the East Room of the Mandeville Center at the University of California, San Diego.

The exhibit, titled, "New World Utopias: A Photographic History of the Search for Community 1875-1975," is being presented as a part of the 69th annual meeting of the American Historical Association's Pacific Coast Branch at UC San Diego. The display is free and open to the public from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

During the association's meeting, members will be attending various sessions covering a diversity of subjects led by historians from throughout the western states and western Canadian provinces. Topics range from "Zepplins and Junkers: German Technology of Flight in the Inter-War Years" to "Water Resource Development in the West."

Keynote speaker for the meeting will be Arthur Bestor, professor of history at the University of Washington and president of the association. Local speakers include San Diego State University professors Andrew Appleby, R. Griswold del Castillo, Alvin D. Coox, Stanley Pincetl, Ita Sheres, Charles D. Smith, Francis N. Stites, Douglas H.
