Metropolitan Opera star Phyllis Curtin will sing a program of classical and modern music in a recital in La Jolla at 8:30 p.m., Sunday, April 6.

The famous soprano returned to this country only two weeks ago after playing her first role at the great La Scala Opera in Milan, Italy. She appears under the auspices of the University of California's All-University Concert series at Sherwood Hall, Art Center in La Jolla.

Widely acclaimed for her operatic triumphs in this country and abroad, Miss Curtin will be heard in songs by Handel, Mozart, and others. On the program are four of Samuel Barber's "Hermit Songs." The texts of these are genuine mediaeval lyrics, written by Irish monks.

The All-University Concerts are presented under terms of a recent private endowment which sponsors programs of lectures and concerts in the several University communities in the State.

Tickets for the event are \$1.00 for students, \$2.50 general admission. The \$1.00 student rate applies to all elementary, high school, and college students.
