

"A Streetcar Named Desire" to open

Decadence and dementia are the discomfoting undercurrents running through Tennessee Williams' drama, "A Streetcar Named Desire," which opens in the UCSD Theatre at the University of California, San Diego on March 1.

Arthur Wagner, a UC San Diego drama professor, directs this story of a faded Southern belle who clings to her old values, but who is driven to madness when confronted with the harsh realities of a changing society.

The drama department production will run March 1-4, 7-11, and 14-17 in the UCSD Theatre. Curtain time is 8 p.m. Tickets cost \$4 for general admission and \$3 for students, and tickets are available in the UCSD Theatre Ticket Office on Warren campus, 452-4574.
