

Applications for undergraduate admission for Fall 1975 will be accepted beginning November 1

October 24, 1974

Applications for undergraduate admission for the fall quarter of 1975 will be accepted at the University of California, San Diego beginning Nov. 1.

The open filing period will continue through Nov. 30 and will extend after November only if the campus has not reached its enrollment quotas.

Students should apply during that month to be assured of consideration at UCSD as their first choice of the University of California's eight general campuses.

Application packets for undergraduate admission are available from high school and community college counselors or from the UCSD admissions office, Building 102, Matthews campus. A non-refundable fee of \$20 is required when filing an application.

UCSD will consider all applications filed during November. Applications submitted after the open filing period will be accepted only if enrollment quotas have not been reached.

The quotas limit the number of new freshmen and new advanced standing students who may be admitted. Once quotas have been filled, additional applicants are redirected to other UC campuses where enrollments are still open.

If UCSD exceeds its enrollment quota during the open filing period, some applicants will be requested to consider one of the other UC campuses in accord with preferences listed on their applications.

Last year, UCSD reached its quota by Dec. 1 except for Third College which made a special allowance to accept additional applications.
