

## All UC Golf Tournament will initiate new golf club

**March 14, 1968**

The second annual All-University of California Golf Tournament, hosted this year by the University's San Diego campus, will initiate the new Lomas Santa Fe Country Club in Solana Beach, Monday and Tuesday, March 18 and 19.

The Lomas Santa Fe course was designed by Billy Bell and is under the direction of golf professional Charles Rizzo. The All-Cal tournament will be the first play on the course which will not officially open until April. The course is being furnished free of cost to the University for the tournament. UCSD hopes to have use of the new facility for its home course in the future.

Seven of the nine UC campuses will enter teams in the two-day, 36-hole event. They are Berkeley, Davis, Riverside, Santa Barbara, Irvine, Los Angeles and San Diego. The San Francisco Medical Center does not field an intercollegiate golf team and the Santa Cruz campus has not entered the tournament.

Each campus will enter six intercollegiate players with the tournament consisting of 36 holes of stroke play over the 6,174-yard, par-72 course. Only the top five scores will be counted for team championship. Tee off time will be noon on Monday and 10:00 a.m. on Tuesday.

Each team coach has been invited to bring one guest for the tournament and coaches and guests will play in a separate tournament coinciding with the All-Cal event.

The teams will be housed at the Torrey Pines Inn Motel just north of the UCSD campus. A tournament banquet will be held at the Inn at 6:00 p.m. Monday following the first round of play. Final awards will be made at the Lomas Santa Fe course on Tuesday following play.

Awards will be given for first, second and third place teams with the members of the winning team receiving key chains. In addition, the five medalists will receive awards.
